

BARTLETT, William John, Retired:— Founder and late proprietor of Bartlett's Goulburn Brewery. Established, 1874. Address: Goulburn, N.S.W. He was President and Chairman of Free Trade Liberal Association, 1880-1905; Chairman, Campaign Committee for Wm. Teece, Cecil Teece, Dr. Hollis and Hon. James Ashton, in the Goulburn Electoral District. Born: Durham, England, July 1840. Son of John Jacob Christian and Anna (nee Guthrie) Bartlett, of Durham, England. Educated: Grammar School at Durham. Came to Australia, 1863. Joined the British Navy, 1854, and in 1856 joined the Mercantile Service in England. Received his First Mate Certificate, 1862. Followed the sea till 34, and then came to Australia. After the diggings in Australia to 1874, he then settled in Goulburn, and with Mr. Oddy founded and opened the Goulburn Brewery, November 9, 1874. In 1878 he purchased Mr. Oddy's interest in the Brewery and in 1921 sold the Brewery to Tooth & Co., of Sydney and retired. He presented the City of Goulburn with 43 acres known as Rocky Hill for the erection of a War Memorial, and also a further 37 acres known as "Memorial Park," in 1922. Takes an active interest in all Local, State and Masonic Institutions. Served as seaman in the British Navy during the Crimean war, 1855-56. Married: Isabella Marie Atkinson Taylor, only daughter of Wm. Taylor of Goulburn, March 5, 1879. Clubs and Societies: Member Ancient Mariners; Masonic Lodge (P.G.W.S.), Goulburn Lodge of Australia, No. 58. Recreations: Reading and Gardening.
