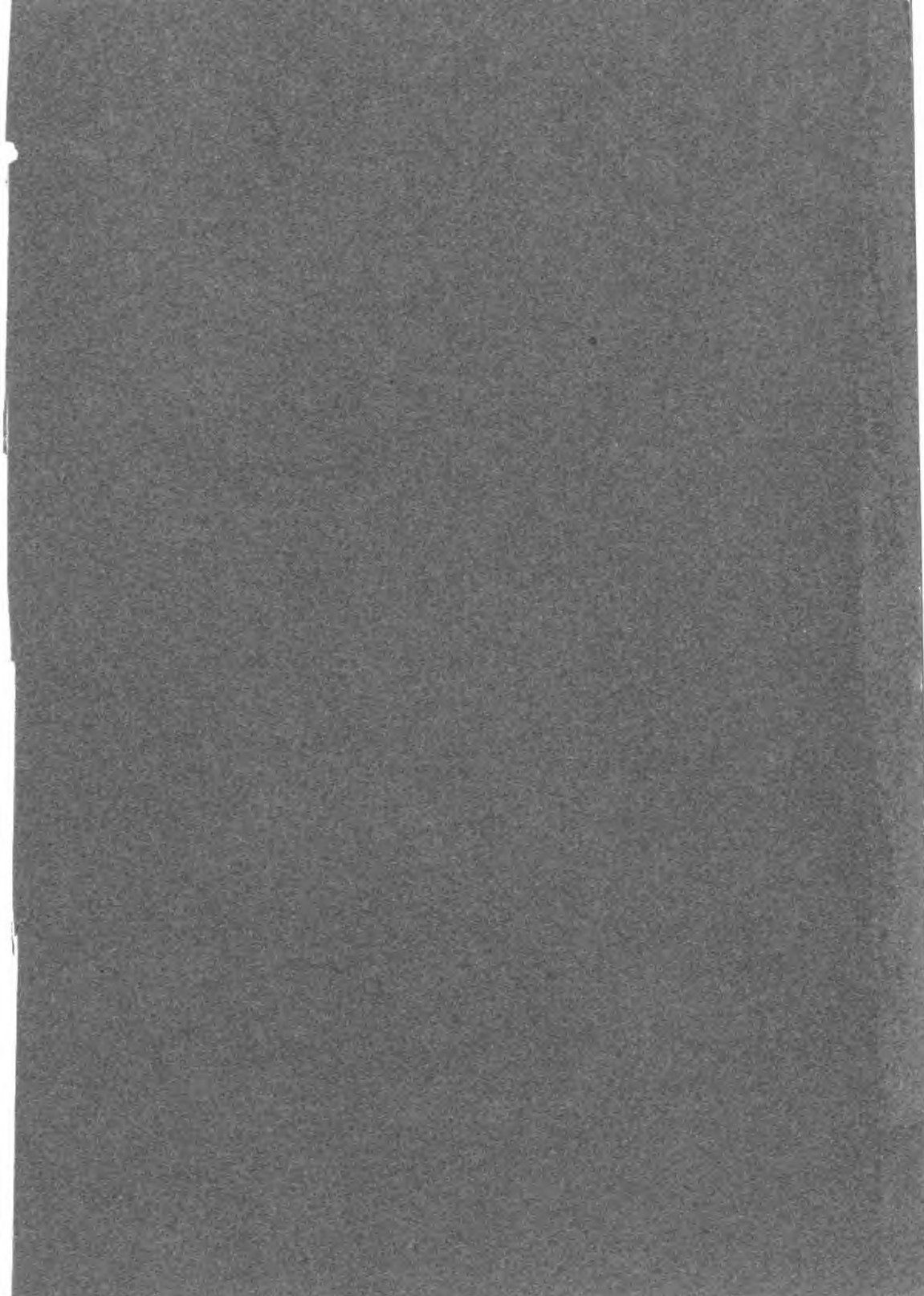

THE FORTH BRIDGE.—THE LABOUR OF 5000 MEN FOR SEVEN YEARS, DAY
AND NIGHT. COST OVER £3,500,000.

Total length of viaducts over 1½ miles, including approaches. Two clear spans of 1710 ft. each. Two spans of 680 ft. each. Highest part above high water level, 361 ft. Deepest foundations below high water level, 91 ft. Weight of steel work, 51,000 tons. Number of rivets, 8,500,000. Engineers:—Sir John Fowler and Sir Benjamin Baker. Contractor:—Sir William Arrol.

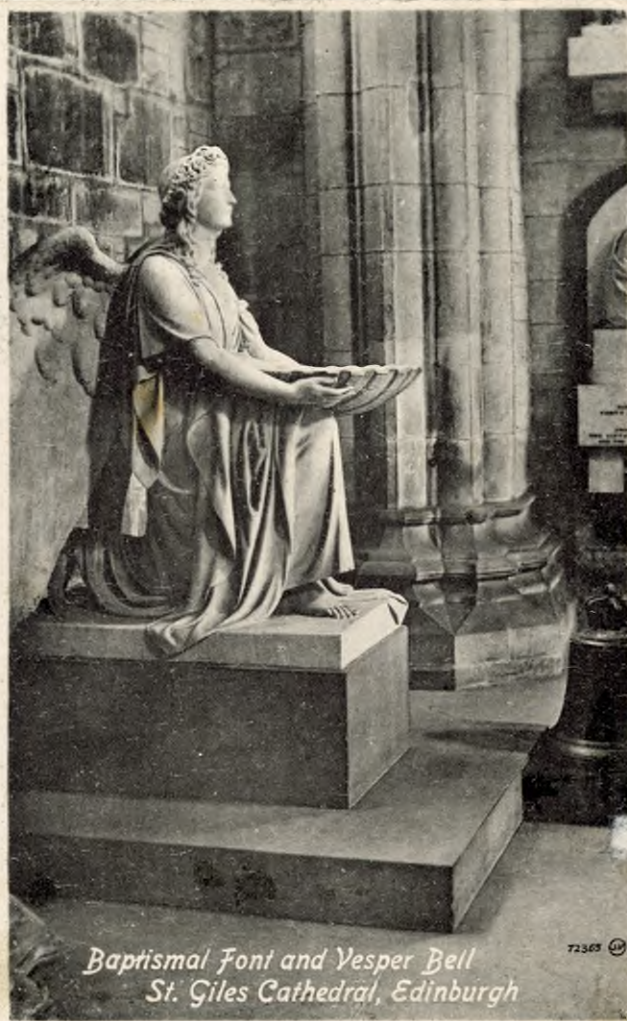

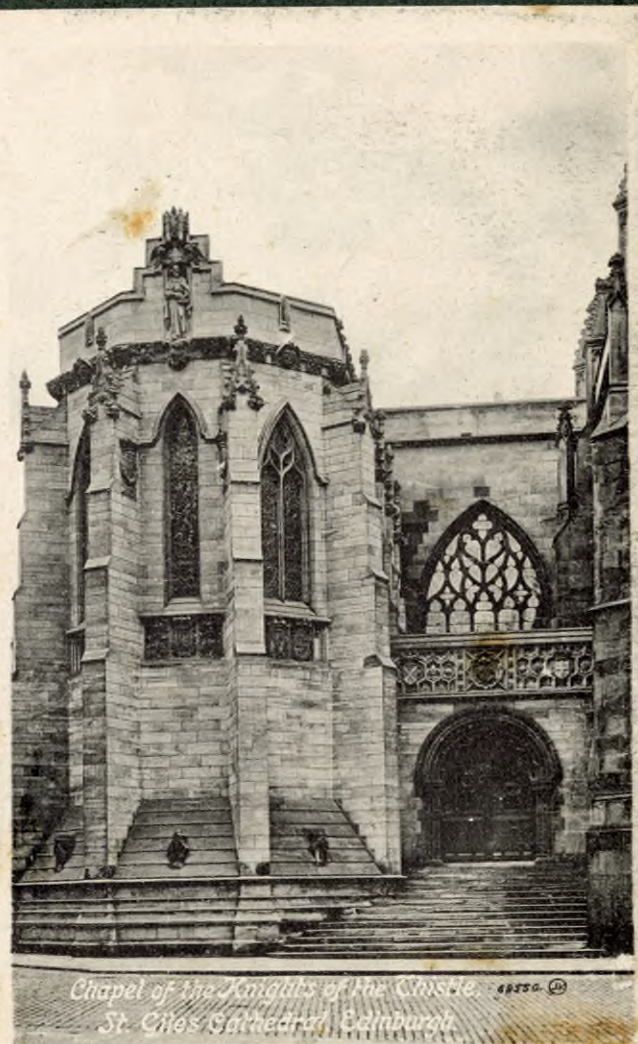

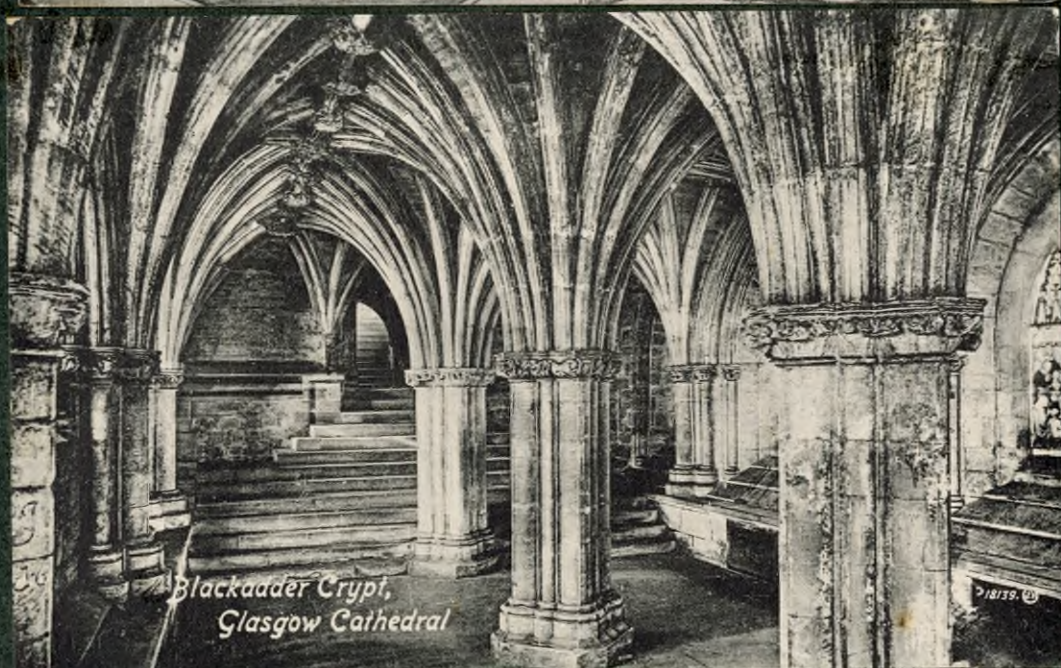

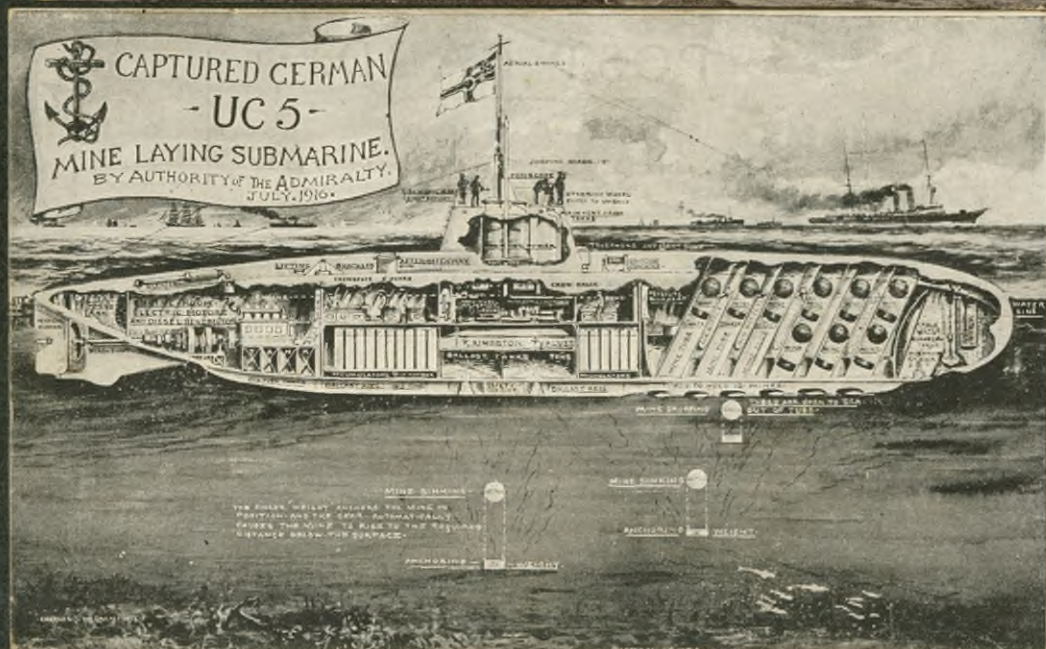

Westbury White Horse. This picturesque memorial of Alfred the Great's decisive victory over the Danes at Ethandunes (Edington) A.D. 878, is situated about two miles from the town of Westbury. It was formed by stripping the turf from the chalk downs on the northern slope of Salisbury Plain. The extreme length of the Horse from head to tail, both included 175 feet. Height from feet to shoulder, 107 feet. Circumference of eye, 25 feet.
