The above design was suggested to the proposers by the magnificent monument erected by the Argyle Sutherland Highlanders in France. The material, although a matter of detail, might be of local Marulan marble.

The proportions would be entirely governed by the height, and should in the opinion of the proposers, be fixed by expert advice; but this memorial, at the height of 50 feet, would have a most commanding appearance from the city.

The striking features are more especially the inverted bronze sword, which would certainly rivet the attention of the most casual observer. A very fine approach is suggested by Sir Charles Rosenthal, of a winding flight of steps of similar material to the monument.

THE RISING SUN IDEA

Mr. Lee Hunt and Mr. T. Brennock have brought forward again the suggestion of emblazoning on the hill the rising sun of the A.I.F. and the word Anzac. Both could be picked out in white or coloured stone by trenching on the hill. They claim that this should be incorporated with any memorial.
