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

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

FESTIVAL AWARDS

12th YEAR OF THE OFFICIAL **COMPETITION AND** SYDNEY FILM PRIZE

In 2019 the Official Competition celebrates 12 years of awarding the Sydney Film Prize to each year's most "audacious, cutting-edge and courageous" film. The competition is endorsed by FIAPF, the regulating body for international film festivals, and is judged by a jury of international and Australian filmmakers and industry professionals. The \$60,000 cash prize is presented at SFF's Closing Night ceremony on Sunday 16 June.

DOCUMENTARY AUSTRALIA FOUNDATION AWARD FOR AUSTRALIAN DOCUMENTARY

This prize is supported by Documentary Australia Foundation with a \$10,000 cash partnership acknowledging excellence in documentary production. Up to 10 films of any length are selected for the competition, and the jury awards the cash prize at SFF's Closing Night ceremony. Winners are Academy Award eligible.

DENDY AWARDS FOR AUSTRALIAN SHORT FILMS

SFF's prestigious Australian Short Film Awards were established in 1970 and have been sponsored by Dendy Cinemas for over 26 years. The awards are presented at SFF's Closing Night ceremony on Sunday 16 June

- . The Dendy Live Action Short Award, sponsored by Dendy Cinemas, provides a \$7,000 cash prize to the best Australian short film. Winners are Academy Award eligible.
- The Rouben Mamoulian Award, sponsored by Dendy Cinemas and named after the director who first presented the award in 1974, provides a \$7,000 cash prize to the best Australian short film director.



 The Yoram Gross Animation Award. sponsored by Sandra and Guy Gross in memory of the late Yoram Gross, provides a \$5,000 cash prize to the best Australian animated short film. Winners are Academy Award eligible.





2019 SYDNEY UNESCO CITY OF FILM AWARD

This annual award recognises a trailblazing NSW-based screen practitioner whose work stands for innovation, imagination and extraordinary impact. Create NSW awards a \$10,000 cash prize to the winner at SFF's Closing Night ceremony on Sunday 16 June







EVENT CINEMAS AUSTRALIAN SHORT SCREENPLAY AWARD

The Event Cinemas Australian Short Screenplay Award, sponsored by Event Cinemas, provides a \$5,000 cash prize for the best short screenwriting. All Australian short films screening in the Festival are eligible for this award.

All Sydney Film Festival Award winners are presented with the Festival's signature mesmeric swirl award, designed and handmade in Sydney by our partners Louise Olsen and Stephen Ormandy of Dinosaur Designs.



The Official Competition celebrates that rare but thrilling film that truly moves the art form forward. Innovative, provocative or controversial, they broaden our understanding of the world and say important things in original ways.

The previous Sydney Film Prize winners are: The Heiresses (2018); On Body and Soul (2017); Aquarius (2016); Arabian Nights (2015); Two Days, One Night (2014); Only God Forgives (2013); Alps (2012); A Separation (2011); Heartbeats (2010); Bronson (2009); and Hunger (2008).

Straight from the Cannes Competition, the new film from Kleber Mendonça Filho (*Aquarius*, Sydney Film Prize winner, 2016) and Juliano Dornelles is a searing political parable, a magic realism fable and an explosive genre film. In the near future, in the small village of Bacurau, the people are in mourning at the loss of the matriarch, Carmelita, who lived to be 94. In his eulogy, her son says of her: "In our family, we have everyone from bricklayers to scientists, businesspeople, teachers, gigolos and whores. But no thief was ever born out of her." It serves as an apt description of the town too: a diverse group of people who share a sense of honour and pride. But all is not well in Bacurau. The water supply has been cut off through nefarious political deals, and now it appears that the village has vanished from most maps. Worse yet, unbeknownst to the people of Bacurau, not far away is a group of foreigners planning something extremely sinister. Mendonça Filho and Dornelles delicately build the tension until it explotes in a most unexpected way. In its potent combination of political critique and genre mayhem, *Bacurau* is unique, stunning and a rousing call for solidarity.

Hamish Bennett's quietly powerful feature film debut, told with a warm humour, takes us into the heart of a small rural town in New Zealand, where a community comes together following a loss. Ross (Marshall Napier) has farmed the land all his life, just as his father and grandfather did before him. A largely silent man, Ross's far more exuberant wife Beth (Annie Whittle) is an eager participant in the local choir and a friend to many. When Beth suddenly dies, Ross is crushed but incapable of displaying his emotions. His son Bruce (Cohen Holloway) moves back in and tries to help, but is not suited to the farming life and also has great difficulties in expressing himself. Around them, their friends realise the difficulties, and pitch in to help. Hamish Bennett says: "The characters of *Bellbird* were inspired by my childhood neighbours in the small rural Northland community of Tauraroa... You don't see many outward displays of affection or emotion, but this can't be mistaken for not caring. It's very much the opposite. The love, the loyalty, the reliance — it can all be found in the little moments, buried under the layers of cheeky banter and cow shit." Along with his fine cast, Bennett expertly finds those little moments in this exquisite, gentle film.

Sacha Polak (Hemel, SFF 2012) paints an intimate portrait of a resilient young mother from East London in this compelling tale of youth, motherhood, courage and self-acceptance. After an acid attack by her ex, Jade is left physically and emotionally scarred. But Jade is no passive victim; she makes her own choices – good or bad – and deals with the consequences. Spiralling down a self-destructive path, Jade finds short-lived solace in online liaisons where she finds the passion and connection she has been craving. However, as family life and friendships start to crumble, she may have to hit rock bottom before finding her path back to her daughter and herself. Newcomer Vicky Knight, who was severely burned as a child, is a revelation in her commanding portrayal of a woman with incredible resilience: "vulnerable, flinty, and unashamedly sexual" as described in Variety. The lens of cinematographer Ruben Impens (Broken Circle Breakdown, Raw) deftly captures the nuances of Knight's performance, accentuated by the distinct music, style and vibe of East London youth culture. Formidable directors Lynne Ramsay and Andrea Arnold stand as influences on Sacha Polak's work and with *Dirty God* she joins their ranks.

In Ben Lawrence's beautifully acted debut feature, a war photographer (Hugo Weaving) and a refugee (Andrew Luri) discover a photograph that threatens to destroy them both. Daniel Fisher (Weaving) returns home, and despite his partner's protests, prepares for his next dangerous overseas assignment. At the same time, he is preparing for an upcoming retrospective exhibition of his work from the world's war zones. South Sudanese refugee, Sebastian Aman (Luri) has built a life in Australia, living happily with his wife and young child. When he learns that Daniel's exhibition may display photographs of a massacre in Sebastian's village 15 years earlier, he finds Daniel and appeals to him to exclude those photographs. An unlikely friendship develops between the two men, but it is severely tested when Daniel makes a shocking discovery. Hearts and Bones centres around the relationship of these two men. from very different backgrounds, who bond over their shared trauma. Andrew Luri, who has never acted before and was driving a garbage truck when he auditioned for the role, and Hugo Weaving both brilliantly convey the intricate relationship between the men. With these two powerful performances at its centre, Ben Lawrence has made an intelligent, morally complex and deeply moving film.

On the way home from a particularly galling interview, she happens upon an old ritual. Every January the local priest throws an ornate wooden cross into the river and hundreds of men dive after it. Good fortune and prosperity are guaranteed to the man who retrieves it. Petrunya dives into the water on a whim and manages to grab the cross before the others. Her competitors are furious – how dare a woman take part in their ritual? All hell breaks loose, but Petrunya holds her ground. She won her cross and will not give it up. What follows is a strident, and frequently hilarious, skewering of the prejudices and hypocrisies of the police, the church, the media and even Petrunya's own family.

When a Punch bender goes disastrously and violently wrong, Judy decides to wreak vengeance on those who have wronged her and, as she discovers, many others. Mirrah Foulkes said: "My hope is that this epic female driven vengeance story incubates a wholly original and unique world, speaking volumes through its feminine inversion of the traditional hero's journey. *Judy & Punch* is bat-shit-crazy and fun!" Taking cues from everything from Monty Python to The Crucible to Kill Bill, Judy & Punch is an ambitious film that finds its own singular path.

Alejandro Landes' incendiary allegory follows child soldiers holding a female doctor hostage in a remote jungle location, and won a Special Jury Award at Sundance. A film of lush visuals and raw emotion, Monos adopts the personality of a twisted fairy-tale. Invoking the thematic core of Lord of the Flies, it comments on the dehumanising effect of war and the seemingly endless cycles of violence in many South American nations. But there's no 'once upon a time' here, as Brazilian-born Colombian filmmaker Landes transports audiences to an unnamed mountain jungle in Latin America that can best be described as hell on earth. Teenagers with names such as "Wolf", "Lady", "Rambo" and "Dog" are holding captive an adult prisoner they call Doctora (Julianne Nicholson, excellent). These emotionally destroyed youngsters answer to a shadowy group known as The Organisation. (It's worth noting here that child soldiers brainwashed by the Khmer Rouge were instructed to obey Angkar, which translates as The Organisation). The fracturing of power and breakdown of loyalties in the soldier group is masterfully depicted, alongside Doctora's attempt to master her own version of psychological warfare and break free. This feral and furious drama is set to a score by Mica Levi (Under the Skin) that brilliantly places otherworldly sounds into the nightmare we're watching



ALEJANDRO LANDES is a Colombian director, writer and producer. His directorial debut Cocalero premiered at Sundance in 2007 and was theatrically released in over 20 countries, while his second feature Portirio premiered in the Quinzaine des Réalisateurs at the 2011 Cannes Film Festival. Monos is his third feature film.

Florian Henckel von Donnersmarck (Oscar winner for The Lives of Others) takes a vast view of German history, over three eras, in this remarkable love story inspired by the life of revered artist Gerhard Richter. The film follows Kurt from his childhood in Nazi Germany, to his life as a young artist (now played by Tom Schilling, Oh Boy, SFF 2013) trained to capture the bravery of the working class of East Germany, to someone struggling to find his particular artistic vision when he enjoys freedom of expression in West Germany. At the story's centre is a beautiful and tragic love story, beginning when Kurt falls in love with fellow student Ellie (Paula Beer, Transit, SFF 2018; *Frantz*). Though very much in love, Ellie's father Professor Seeband (Sebastian Koch, The Lives of Others) objects to the relationship and is determined to bring it to an end. With two of Germany's finest young actors, and an incredibly dramatic story. Donnersmarck carefully intertwines the romance with three key eras of German history in a fascinating way. At the same time, we witness how this love, and this history, affect Kurt as an artist who finally finds his own true path.

Pedro Almodóvar reunites with Antonio Banderas and Penelope Cruz in his most personal film vet: a gorgeous reflection on cinema, art, family, love, and sexual awakening. Banderas, in one of his very finest performances, plays Salvador Mallo, who has a fair few things in common with Pedro Almodóvar. Suffering from a range of health issues, Salvador finds himself in a creative rut. He lacks the physical strength to make a film, and this inability to create makes him more depressed. This artistic limbo leads Salvador to reflect on his life, his loves and his films. *Pain and Glory* goes back in time to Salvador's childhood, where he was raised, in poverty, in a cave modelled into a house by his doting mother (played superbly by Cruz). In the present, a reunion with an actor he has long been estranged from leads to an addiction to heroin. Amidst the pain, there are thoughts of past glories, and those hopefully to come, in a film that arrives at a resolute position of hope. As always, there is a meticulous attention to detail, and images and moments that make you swoon in the distinctive way that only a Pedro Almodóvar film can.



PEDRO ALMODÓVAR's first film was Pepi, Luci, Bom in 1980, which began a prolific career Women on the Verge of a Nervous Breakdown was an international success and he went on to win Academy Awards for All About My Mother and Talk to Her. Volver received two awards in Cannes. His most recent films Julieta (SFF 2017) and Pain and Glory both appeared in the

Straight from the Cannes Competition, Bong Joon-ho's stunning follow-up to Okia (SFF 2017) is a thrilling, satirical take on income inequality as told through the story of two families. Bong regular Song Kang-ho (*The Host, Snowpiercer*) plays Ki-taek, whose family of four is close, but hopelessly unemployed. Without prospects, they hustle as best they can to scrape up the money to survive in their subterranean apartment. Hope comes in the form of an unusual offer. The son, Ki-woo, is recommended for a very well-paid tutoring job. Though Ki-woo lacks a university degree, it turns out his sister Ki-jung is a master forger and soon, bearing a fake degree, he is being interviewed at the luxurious home of the very wealthy Park family. Ki-woo gets the job as tutor, and quickly realises that the Park family could well prove to be the solution to his family's money problems. With every frame beautifully composed, *Parasite* vividly contrasts the two families using humour, mystery and a creeping sense of tension. Bong once again skillfully fuses genre elements with social critique in a wildly entertaining, visually extraordinary and intoxicating manner.

BONG JOON-HO was born in Daegu, South Korea, in 1969. He gained significant international attention in 2003 with the crime drama *Memories of Murder* (SFF 2004). Joanna Hogg's dream-like, visually splendid tale of first love stars Honor Swinton Byrne (in a breakout performance) alongside her mother, Tilda Swinton, and Tom Burke. It won the Grand Jury Prize at Sundance this year. Based on elements from Hogg's own life, The Souvenir centres around Julie (Swinton Byrne), a 1980s film student from a privileged background who wishes to make films depicting the harsh social realities of Thatcherite Britain. Into her life comes Anthony (Tom Burke), who's older and charismatic and expresses serious interest in, and ideas about, the films Julie wishes to make. Following a chance meeting, the two embark on a tempestuous love affair. The dapper and sophisticated Anthony says he works for the Foreign Office, and hints at daring, secretive missions. While Julie's mother (Swinton) and her friends express some apprehension, Julie remains devoted, borrowing increasingly large sums of money from her parents to hand over to Anthony. Hogg says: "Making the film, I'm allowing parts of my own biography to be re-imagined and expanded upon and changed. I want it to become something else." The result is a film of great power and unforgettable imagery, perfectly capturing the social milieu, and all the eubhoria of first love and its accompanying harsh realisations.

JOANNA HOGG is considered one of the UK's leading auteurs. Her first feature, Unrelated (2008), starring Tom Hiddleston, won the FIPRESCI Prize and The Guardiar's First Film Award. Proceed with caution into Nadav Lapid's intense, neurotic, uncompromising fever dream about a young Israeli man who goes to Paris to erase his identity. Winner of the Berlinale Golden Bear, the film has Yoav (a brilliant Tom Mercier) turn up in Paris in the hope that France will save him from what he sees as the madness of his country. He refuses to speak Hebrew, and a dictionary becomes his most valuable resource as he walks the streets muttering in French. Things do not begin well for him. Almost immediately all his belongings are stolen, and he is alone, naked and freezing in an apartment. Temporary salvation comes in the form of his neighbours, writer Emile (Quentin Dolmaire) and musician Caroline (Louise Chevillotte), who give him clothes, some cash, and become his first friends in Paris as he embarks on a challenging new life. Mercier's unforgettable performance defies conventional description. Spending much of the film completely naked, he imbues Yoav with a forceful anger and unpredictability. Lapid, whose previous films, Policeman and The Kindergarten Faacher, were critical looks at militarism and commercialism, here takes a scabrous view of identity and nationhood. It's not always easy to watch,



but impossible to look away

NADAV LAPID was born in Tel Aviv, Israel, in 1975, and studied philosophy. After military service, he moved to Paris, before returning to Israel to study at the Sam Spiegel Film & Television School in Jerusalem. His debut feature film *Policeman* (SFF 2012) won the Special Jury Prize at Locarno in 2011. *The Kindegarten Teacher* played Cannes Critics' Week in 2014. *Synonyms* won the Golden Bear at the Berlinale earlier this year.

Noted Sydney philanthropists Peter and Sharon Ivany pledged a \$200,000 gift to Sydney Film Festival.

Peter Ivany's gift attests to his family's strong passion for film and affirms the Festival's reputation as the beating heart of the city's film culture.

"My family and I have always loved that experience of seeing as many films as possible in a few days — walking around in the brisk air of winter between venues and enjoying the buzz of the city," Ivany says. "Getting to travel to three or four different worlds without ever leaving Sydney is a wonderful thing — it's an experience that people will never want to lose."

Peter has long been a patron of the arts (he recently announced a \$1M bequest to the Museum of Contemporary Art), but he holds a special reverence for film.

During his decade-long tenure as CEO of Hoyts Cinemas, the company grew rapidly from a small Australian chain to a global cinema giant, with over 2000 theatres operating in 12 countries. First-generation immigrants and the children of Holocaust survivors, Peter and Sharon are acutely aware of the need for a platform to foreground diverse stories and experiences.

"I've seen perspectives and ideas change in this country over time, and I think that a part of that is having this access to stories from other places that you otherwise would never hear or see," he says. "Australia has given my family and I so much, and it's important for me to give back so that cultural events like Sydney Film Festival can continue to grow."

It's hard to argue with *The Dead Don't Die*'s claim to have "the greatest zombie cast ever disassembled". With a roster of stars including Tilda Swinton, Danny Glover, Selena Gomez, Luka Sabbat, Iggy Pop, RZA and Tom Waits, the scene is set for all manner of mayhem. Centerville, population 738, is a close-knit town where not a lot ever happens. A series of unnatural occurrences triggers widespread panic and, even worse, the dead start rising from their graves, with an appetite for living flesh. As ever, the rule "if you've got to kill the dead, kill the head" applies, but these are resilient zombies, and constantly growing in number. Jarmusch handles the well-trodden genre with levity and extreme strangeness — and the result is a joy to behold.

From childhood, Michael Hutchence's onscreen charisma is palpable, so it comes as no surprise when his career takes off. With his exuberant voice and pulsating stage presence, he gathered fans by the thousands and sold records by the millions. His sensuality pops off the screen, and his love affairs with women such as Helena Christensen, Kylie Minogue and Paula Yates appear superheated and achingly romantic. But a traumatic brain injury and growing drug problem brought the dream to a tragic end in Sydney, 1997. It's rare for a music documentary to feel so firmly rooted in time and place. Lowenstein does this by keeping us in the heat of the moment, on stage or backstage, and the result is nothing short of magnetic.

The result is a powerful film that holds a mirror to Australia and suggests we reconsider what happened on and off the football field.

The extremely shy Miloni is from a different social milieu to Rafi and is herself being pressured into marriage by her parents. The deception leads to many funny incidents, but also genuine tenderness between Rafi and Miloni.



Celeste (Maria Isabel Diaz. Volver) takes her job as a Havana Planetarium guide very seriously, sharing the wonders of the universe with visiting children. Like everyone, she is rather surprised to discover that aliens have been living amongst the Cuban people and have now decided to reciprocate by inviting a select few people to visit their planet. Celeste is given a special invitation and along with a ragtag bunch – those escaping crimes, or pursuing impossible romances – prepares to leave Earth. For Celeste, a painful past could give way to a future of happiness and love. With deadpan humour, the film also makes gentle political commentary: the visitors from the planet Gryok, for instance, were just thought to be Russians!

In one scene, Sequin connects with a mysterious stranger, but they are separated suddenly. Utterly fixated on this man, Sequin sets off on an exhilarating and perilous mission to track him down

Penney — ultimately a poor decision. Tcheng delivers a fascinating portrait of an absolutely fabulous fashion legend.

Nargis, Zahra, and their parents start out buoyant but the pressures of spending day after day in refugee camps soon take their toll. This vérité film reveals the tragedy and the horror of the family's lengthy pursuit of asylum, particularly poignant when seen through the lens of the two young girls.

Herzog conducted a series of interviews with 87-year-old Gorbachev, still a consummate politician, over six months. These conversations are intercut with archival footage and interviews with key figures from the era. Herzog (Into The Abyss, Cave of Forgotten Dreams SFF 2011, Grizzly Man) demonstrates a genuine affection for his subject, underlining the poignancy with which they discuss Gorbachev's political reforms, his beloved wife Raisa, and his significant legacy.

When they finally embarked on a calculated seven steps to 'a disciplinary democracy' it seemed as if times would change. Nobel Prize-winner Aung San Suu Kyi was released from house arrest, and the rest of the world applauded. But as this film demonstrates, both history and power are not so easily discarded. Director Karen Stokkendal Poulsen talked to leading figures in Myanmar, including National League of Democracy spokesperson Win Hein, former President Their Sein and Cabinet Speaker Shwe Mann. Their interviews illustrate Myanmar's challenging path: does democracy have any hope of taking root in a country that has no democratic tradition?

Rudnitskaya follows the women for seven years as they chase their dreams of success. In a society where money and prestige are everything, it's not surprising that happiness means designer clothes and a nice apartment. This absorbing documentary delivers outrage and comedy, while providing a sharp insight into the gender gap in 21st century Russia.

Born in Palermo, Sicily, Battaglia took up photojournalism in her 30s, after a teenage marriage ended in divorce. She began to focus on the activities of the Cosa Nostra in her hometown. Battaglia's stark black and white photographs captured the victims; not just the corpses strewn on the street, but also the grief-stricken relatives. In the mid-1980s to '90s, as the Mafia's campaigr of violence and intimidation grew (culminating in the death of investigating magistrate Giovanni Falcone), she switched her focus to politics, working as a Green Party councillor. Filimmaker Longinotto (Salma, Rough Aunties, SFF 2009; Sisters in Law, SFF 2005) has found a laudable addition to her chronicle of vibrant women in the impassioned and fiercely independent 80-something Battaglia.

Patwardhan is renowned for his films chronicling injustice in his homeland, with documentaries such as Jai Bhim Comrade (SFF 2012), Father, Son and Holy War (SFF 1995) and In the Name of God (SFF 1993). In Reason, he addresses India's slide from a secular democracy to a more divisive society, fractured by power, caste and religious belief. He charts the rise of right-wing Hindu extremists driven by media-fuelled popularism, who habitually accuse minority groups of 'treason against Mother India' or 'eating cow meat' — violence frequently ensues. In eight chapters — using interviews, captured footage and archive sequences — Patwardhan depicts and deplores this frightening shift in the world's largest democracy.

The determined foursome has a plan to restore an outdoor theatre in a city just outside Khartoum, but a lack of money and equipment, red tape and official censorship thwart their plans. Sudan-born director Gasmelbari contemplates the demise of Sudan's once-budding film industry and the communal cinema experience with a melancholic eve. but not without humour and hope.

The truth finally emerged in 2017 and the monster was subsequently toppled. In Ursula Macfarlane's empowering documentary (produced by Academy Award-winner Simon Chinn) Weinstein's former employees, as well as journalists and actors such as Rosanna Arquette, Nannette Klatt and Paz de la Huerta, speak directly to the camera about their experiences. You may think that you've heard it all, but the frank interviews with the women he abused paint an agonising, less tabloid, and more complex picture.

He offers drawing lessons to numerous guests, including elderly village ladies who produce colourful folk canvases. The women are delightful, chattering as they paint and cook, revealing much about their calm approach to the ups and downs – the very rhythms – of life. One of Shen's pupils is less serene: newly married, he's torn between staying and leaving for the big city. His story exemplifies the clash between modernity and tradition in today's China. Using an aspect ratio similar to a painting, director Zhang Yang (Festival favourite *Shower*, SFF 1999) has crafted an exquisite, unhurried portrait of a community and the joy of creating.

Her legacy is profound and far-reaching, While there's sadness at her loss to the living world, it's an absolute pleasure to spend time with this eternally playful filmmaker as she yet again blurs the line between fact and fiction — keeping audiences on their cinematic toes.

Hye-Ryoung Park's poignant documentary illustrates the deep connection between food, ritual and memory.

Over two days at L.A.'s New Temple Missionary Baptist Church, accompanied by the Southern Californian Community Choir, Aretha sang from the heart and her astounding performance was captured by filmmaker Sydney Pollack. The resulting recording, Amazing Grace, became her most successful album, but the film of her performance — for multiple reasons — was never released...until now. In the audience her father, legendary gospel singers and Mick Jagger are squished alongside camera crew and sound technicians. But all eyes and ears are on the Queen of Soul herself — and she's never been more mesmerising.

In a confessional mood, he discusses the many opportunities and fine women (Joni Mitchell included) that he turned down in favour of coke or heroin. He recalls the Laurel Canyon parties, the hippy scene, and his collaborators — Stephen Stills, Graham Nash and Neil Young. In the 1970s, when the band was riding a wave, the songwriter-singeriguitarist persistently wore out his welcome with his wild man antics. Outspoken, irascible Crosby was never going to be an easy man to document, but first-time director A.J. Eaton does an impressive tob of showing the man behind the distinctive mo.

The love affair that began on an idyllic Greek island between Leonard Cohen and his muse, Marianne, inspired one of his most adored songs.

"I wrote this song for Marianne, I hope she's here," said Cohen at the 1970 Isle of Wight music festival. The couple met on the bohemian Island of Hydra In 1960, when Cohen was a struggling poet-writer and Norwegian Marianne Ihlen a single mother recovering from an unhappy marriage. Cohen eventually left to pursue his writing career, and by chance to become a musician. Their relationship ebbed and flowed over successive decades. The documentary traces Cohen's career and their love story, using wonderful archival footage and interviews, to the bittersweet end. Pertinently, director Nick Broomfield (Whitney: Can I Be Me, SFF 2017) met Marianne on Hydra in 1988, and she inspired him to make his first film.

An insightful bio-doc of the legendary Miles Davis, the man and musician, packed with revealing newly released archival footage and interviews with friends like Quincy Jones.

For Miles Davis, music was always there – it came before everything. Born in small town "racist to the bone" Illinois, he was gifted a trumpet as a young teen. In 1944, he headed to New York: studying, frequenting clubs and meeting his idols (including Dizzy and Bird). A stay in post-war Paris (where jazz was on a high and segregation non-existent) changed his thinking, but on returning to America, depression and drugs held sway, until he played a career-changing set at the 1955 Newport Jazz Festival. The story of his musical development and fierce creativity, life and loves is vividly and movingly told using the iconic musician's own words (read by Carl Lumbly) from his muchadmired 1989 autobiography.



Zombie-fighting sisters confront the undead while unpacking their own complicated past. A desperate housewife escapes into vivid fantasy as she attempts to cope with patriarchal dominance. A woman juggles family commitments with helping victims of domestic violence. A teenage mother-to-be shows pluck and determination in trying to thwart her seemingly destined path.

In Sydney Film Festival's fourth annual Europe! Voices of Women in Film program, proudly co-presented by European Film Promotion and Sydney Film Festival with media partner Screen International since 2016, these stories and more are thrust into the spotlight

In an industry still struggling to achieve gender parity and inclusivity, still reluctant to champion female filmmakers in general, but overflowing with pioneering women, it remains crucial to showcase the essential talents behind them — directors from Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, Denmark, Germany, Greece, Iceland, the Netherlands, Sweden and the United Kingdom.



A repertory cinema from the days when films weren't accessible online, there were only three TV channels, and home video stores were yet to open, it was a movie treasure trove. The Scala presented a mix of Hollywood classics, world cinema, martial arts, music, camp and queer films, and regular all-night screenings. It was as notorious as it was influential. Until then, cinema for me had been entertaining or edifying, but seldom shocking or outrageous. At the Scala, I discovered that films could be provocative, trashy, surreal, troubling, and not always in English. Looking back with 30 Sydney Film Festivals under my belt, I wanted to celebrate that time; the moment when cinema truly opened its doors to me. This All Night Cine-Love In may change your cinematic world, and if it doesn't...well, it's going to be a great night at the movies.

One of the most controversial films in cinema history, this uncompromising '70s study of sexual obsession from radical director Nagisa Oshima is based on a true incident.

A servant and former geisha, Sada (Eiko Matsuda), becomes sexually obsessed with her married employer, a businessman called Kizochi (Tatsuya Fuji). He in turn becomes captivated with her, until their every waking hour is spent making love. However, as the relationship intensifies, their sexual acts become more and more dangerous and aggressive, cumulating in a shockingly fatal undertaking. Oshima's (Merry Christmas Mr Lawrence) taboo-breaking film, notorious for its actual sex scenes, was screened at the 1977 Sydney Film Festival, but was subsequently cut by the censors and given an R-rating. Decades after its initial release Ai No Corrida (literally translated as 'bullfight of love') retains the power to provoke and offend.

Malcolm McDowell stars in this more-thantwisted tale of a man's rise to the top (and down again) by UK Free Cinema legend Lindsay Anderson.

Anderson's debut film, If, was a scorching critique of 1960s Britain and his follow-up, O Lucky Man! doesn't pull any punches either. McDowell plays Mick, a principled young man who travels the country, encountering corruption everywhere, from genetic engineering to gunrunning, Mick soon joins in with the capitalist fun, before falling foul of the crooked system. Chock-full of venom and sour British humour, O Lucky Man! features a brilliant soundtrack from Alan Price (ex-The Animals, he also appears in the film) and menacing imagery from Miroslav Ondřiček (Amadeus). Helen Mirren, who starred alongside McDowell, said she "loved" Anderson because he was always, "the pepper in the arse of the establishment" – one can't help but agree!

It's a very strange evening, featuring the now-infamous spurting chickens and a peculiar premature 'baby'. The young couple take the squealing bundle home, but Mary soon departs leaving Henry to handle the nightmarish nipper alone. What follows has been described as indescribable – suffice to say it's brilliant! Lynch's debut feature was made over several years on a shoestring budget. Shot by the great Frederick Elmes (*Blue Velvet*) with an amazing soundscape of industrial noise and Fats Waller music.



Seamlessly inhabiting the worlds of fiction, documentary and contemporary art, Agnès Varda explored the world with a tireless curiosity for people and the places they inhabit.

This season traverses the French countryside, the Parisian streets Varda called home and the sunny climes of California where she made some of he most astounding and singular works as a director

Born in Brussels in 1928 to a Greek father and Belgian mother, her family relocated to France during the Occupation. With the exception of a few brief stints in America, Paris was the city that Agnès Varda called home until her passing on March 29, 2019.

As a young woman Agnès studied philosophy at the Sorbonne and art history at Ecole du Louvre. Photography was her first medium and taking Santa nictures at Galeries Lafavette her first joh In her role at the Théâtre National Populaire, she documented some of France's most prestigious stage talents, but in 1951 she met Alain Resnais and her interest in cinema began to bloom



"I thought of all my films as a woman, because I didn't want to be a 'false man' making films. I was trying to make films about what I knew.

A vital presence in the cinematic landscape during her lifetime and beyond, Varda's artistic endeavours paid witness to times of great social revolution. The personal is political in Varda's world, alongside the humanity, wonder and endless artistic experimentation.

As Daniel Trilling noted in Sight & Sound, "the blurring of the boundaries between art and life is absolutely crucial to Varda's work. To watch one of her films is to be drawn gently into an entire world "

Charting two different stories, respected theatre actors Philippe Noiret and Silvia Monfort play an intellectual Parisian couple at a crossroads; and in the alternate story, the villagers of Sète, on the southeast coast of France, enact scenarios drawn from their own reality. An unforgettable work of stark contrasts and filmic complexity, *La Pointe* Courte was credited by film historian Georges Sadoul as "genuinely the first film of the nouvelle vague." It's exhilarating to consider that Varda had no formal training, and had seen virtually no other films, before embarking on filming La Pointe Courte

A coquettish pop star Cléo (the stunning Corinne Marchand) is riddled with anxiety as she awaits medical results. Restless and alone. she takes to the streets, observing the city and its inhabitants. As Cléo moves through the hours of 5 to 7pm, Varda's heroine shifts from being an object of others' attentions to an active participant in the world. An enduring film within Varda's wider filmography, Cléo From 5 to 7 remains an example of her distinctive artistic style and a radical break with social, gender and cinematic traditions

In the Hollywood Hills, Varda's 'Lions' (Ragni Rado and Viva) spend their days lounging by the pool, lazing in their giant bed and contemplating how to achieve spiritual enlightenment. When a frenetic New Yorker arrives, played by director Shirley Clarke (Portrait of Jason), their carefree existence starts to warp. Employing non-traditional actors and various film styles and approaches to performance. Agnès Varda dubbed Lions Love and Lies) a "film collage". Set against a backdrop of the Warhol assassination attempt and the Bobby Kennedy shooting, Varda's far-out tale gives way to a deeper statement on Hollywood and the American Dream.

Rue Daguerre, in the 14th arrondissement of Paris, served as office, editing suite and home for Agnès Varda from 1951. People and place form the bedrock of Varda's filmmaking, and both are beautifully exemplified in this cinéma vérité documentary: an investigation of community and body politics that reveals the dreams and illusions of the residents of this humble French high street. The film opens with Mystag the magician, who acts as narrator, alongside Varda, for an illuminating stroll on the Rue Daguerre. In her observations of the baker, grocer, butcher, perfumer and laundress, Varda is unobtrusive but inquisitive, gleaning information about the shopkeepers' histories and hopes, presenting an enchanting vision of the beauty and universality of daily life.

Mur Murs mirrors some of Varda's most beloved documentaries such as The Gleaners and I and the recent Faces Places: celebrating humanity and finding the extraordinary in the everyday.

Varda infuses Documenteur with the authenticity of a woman who has known heartbreak but has not fallen prey to self-pity. Émilie is down but far from broken and watching her interpret the city offers a refreshingly rare onscreen heroine, and a fascinating take on life in the "City of Angels".

What transpires is a portrait of a defiant, headstrong young woman, played with steely-eyed authenticity by Sandrine Bonnaire. Purposefully living on the margins of society, Mona elicits strong reactions: from the young men who see her as 'easy prey' to those who see sorrow and others a beacon of freedom. Varda infuses Mona with such complexity that it's impossible not to feel vindicated, shamed and inspired all at once; the film remains one of her most complex and

Sydney Film Festival retrospectives have usually focused on the work of one significant filmmaker, and so far, those filmmakers have all been men. This year, rather than highlighting the work of one director, we're looking at the work of ten remarkable women.

The key woman director of the late silent and early sound period in Australia was Paulette McDonagh (1901-1978) who made four features between 1926 and 1933, one of which, *The Cheaters* (1929), is included in this retrospective.

After Two Minutes Silence (1933), the last of McDonagh's films, we had to wait 46 years for another feature to be directed by a woman in this country – the film was My Brilliant Career (1979), and the director was Gillian Armstrong. Armstrong has gone on to a brilliant career, and this retrospective includes High Tide (1987), the film that reunited her with Judy Davis.

In the years since Armstrong's trailblazing debut, a great many very talented women have directed important and enduring films in this country. This retrospective is a tribute to all of them, and not just to the ten women represented here.

The recurring theme of the 10 films in this retrospective is that of family. Mother and daughter are reunited in *High Tide*, sisters feature in both *Sweetie* (1989) and *Love Serenade* (1996), mothers and children of both sexes in *Blessed (2008)*, mother and son in *The Babadook* (2014). *Beautiful Kate* (2009) is about a family reunion, *Waiting* (1991) is a film in which close friends become surrogates for family, and in *Malcolm* (1986), two very different men form an almost fraternal relationship.

In the era of the #MeToo movement, the barriers that once faced women filmmakers are perhaps crumbling at a quicker pace. Hopefully it won't be long before the annual film production in this country is truly representative of its population. In the meantime, let's celebrate this tribute to some of our great women filmmakers.

Nadia Tass's debut, with screenplay and photography by her husband David Parker, is a genuinely fresh comedy about the unlikely friendship between a reclusive orphan. Malcolm (Colin Friels, brilliant), and Frank (John Hargreaves) a resourceful criminal. Malcolm avoids human and even animal contact. He spends his time making elaborate models, mechanical devices - including a home-made tram, or the car that splits into two - that appear to have no practical use, until Frank dreams up a way to use them for criminal purposes. The robbing of a bank via remote control is a highlight. Lindy Davies is a splendid heroine and the supporting cast includes such stalwarts as Chris Haywood, Charles Tingwell and John Stanton. The film's entertainment value ensured its commercial success, belying its modest budget.

Eight years after the trailblazing My Brilliant Career, Gillian Armstrong and Judy Davis collaborated again on High Tide, with Davis winning the New York Film Critics' award for Best Actress. The setting is Eden on the NSW South Coast where Lilli (Davis), a back-up singer for Elvis imitator Frankie J Holden, becomes stranded. This provides an opportunity for her to be reunited with Ally (Claudia Karvan), her long-lost daughter, who lives with her grandmother (Jan Adele). The screenplay by Laura Jones avoids any hint of cheap sentimentality—instead this is a raw and deeply felt movie in which the fractured relationships are painfully real. Colin Friels makes a strong impression in a key supporting role, but it's the links between the three women that make the film unforgettable.

It's the story of two sisters, Kay (Karen Colston), a shy factory worker who is scared of trees but trusts fortune tellers, and Dawn aka Sweetie (Genevieve Lemon), who invades the suburban home where Kay is living with Louis (Tom Lycos), accompanied by her spacedout 'producer', Bob (Michael Lake), Filled with eccentric characters and situations — the dancing jackaroos are a hoot! — and all of it superbly photographed by Sally Bongers, this remarkable slice of Australiana, with its choral music and quirky mood shiftling, is a genuine original from one of the world's great contemporary filmmakers.

It's a frank and beautifully-made film about friendship, sexual politics and infidelity, with beautifully photographed scenes of chaos as the little house fills with people. The ghosts include an American soldier, a blind child killed on the railway tracks, and a pair of young lovers. Moffatt, who appears in one of the stories, is experimenting here with a fresh and unusual narrative style. None of the stories are told in a traditional way. The use of painted backdrops combined with spectacular actuality footage, plus the stirring use of music, adds up to a strange and very beautiful movie. One great sequence involves the preparation of a meal of yabbies with Chardonnay and Hollandaise sauce followed by snake terrine.

Miranda Otto and Rebecca Frith play sisters who share a house in the small town of Sunray. Their lives are turned upside down by the arrival in town of a 'celebrity' – a lazy, self-indulgent ex-hippy (George Shevtsov) – "wirgins are my specialty!" – who takes over the local one-man radio station. The other principal character is the owner of the local Chinese restaurant (John Alansu), who practises nudism. Barrett's keenly whimsical approach to this eccentric material is enhanced by Mandy Walker's splendid photography, but it's the unexpectedly surreal elements that stay in the memory.

This achingly moving, harshly powerful film takes us into the world of four mothers whose children are in serious trouble. Frances O'Connor leads a fine cast.

Ana Kokkinos's film is divided into two parts. In the first, *The Children*, we follow a group of kids who get into trouble in various different ways. In the second, *The Mothers*, we cover the same time frame but from the perspective of the mothers. The latter are superbly portrayed by Miranda Otto, Deborra-Lee Furness, Frances O'Connor and Victoria Haralabidou, while the cast also includes Wayne Blair, Monica Maughan and William McInnes. Kokkinos sometimes depicts the same incident as seen from two different perspectives, and her sympathy for all of these characters, flawed as some of them are, is palpable. Confronting at times, but honest and powerful, this is surely one of the greatest Australian films of recent years.

For her feature film debut as director, Rachel Ward adapted an American book written by Newton Thornburg in 1984. It's a story of a family torn apart by feelings of guilt about the events that occurred one summer several years ago. Ben Mendelsohn is Ned, who returns from the city to the isolated property, together with his girlfriend (Maeve Dermody), to see his father (Bryan Brown in one of his finest roles), who is dying. There Ned meets his sister, Sally (Rachel Griffiths), who has stayed at home to look after things. The reunion triggers painful memories of Ned's twin sister, "beautiful" Kate (Sophie Lowe). The hothouse atmosphere of the remote homestead is superbly captured in this evocative, sometimes erotic, movie.
