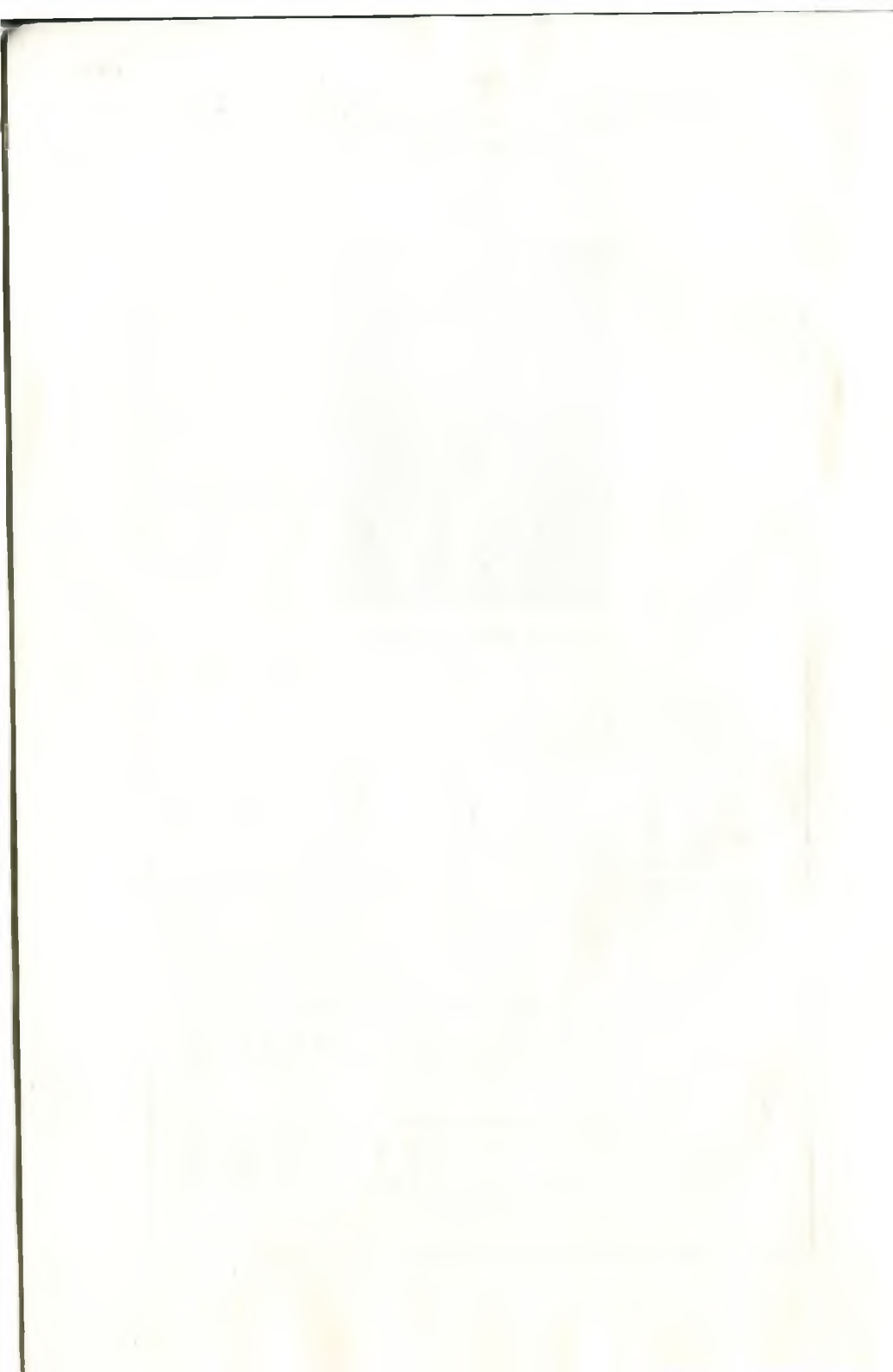

Obituary

Sudden Death of Len Kelly

The sudden death of Len Kelly on Tuesday, November 3, took from the St. George Rugby League Football Club a footballer and official who made a major contribution to its continued success.

Popularly known as The Deacon, Len was in district football for 50 years and his name will live on for years to come because of his efforts for the code, first as a player, then as an official.

Len was in The St. George Hospital earlier in the year for a major operation and he never recovered from it. He knew he did not have long to live but it did not alter his attitude to life. He continued his activities, never shirking his responsibilities and never referring to the discomforts he must have been experiencing.

He attended a meeting of the St. George League's Club then a gathering of football officials and players to meet new coach Roy Masters on the Wednesday night before he died six days later.

Len was a true Saint. He was made a life-member of the club in 1953. He was also a life-member of the N.S.W. Rugby Football League and the St. George League's Club, of which he was a director since 1968.

Len achieved so much in Rugby League during his 50 year period with the club that his record would have to be unique.

He had some temporary breaks from the club. One was to coach Picton, another to act on the N.S.W. and Australian selection committees, and another when he managed a hotel in Cooma.

Len came to St. George originally from the Sutherland Junior Club after featuring in the B grade premiership which his team won. He was

selected in the St. George President's Cup side and was quickly promoted to St. George.

It was not long before he was in first grade and toured New Zealand with St. George shortly after his introduction into the top side. In 1938 he was selected in City Seconds to play Country as a lock-forward and excelled with a spectacular display, scoring three tries.

But Len, to the disappointment of his supporters, could not get the necessary breaks to make the big time because of the wealth of forward talent available at that period.

He partnered Neville Smith, the captain-coach, in the second row of the St. George pack which skittled Easts in the 1941 final to bring the club its first first grade premiership. It was one of Len's best displays. The Easts second row was test forwards Joe Pearce and Harry Pierce.

Len was the first to appear in 200 matches with a district club. He became club president in 1962, a position he held until 1978. He was also a delegate to the N.S.W. Rugby League over a similar period. Len also managed a representative N.S.W. tour to Queensland.

He was a member of the club's management committee for more than 20 years and gave a lifetime to the game in many capacities.

**NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER, 1981**

NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting policies

In order to assist in the understanding of the figures presented in the accounts, the following summary explains significant accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the accounts. Unless otherwise stated such accounting policies are consistent with those used in the previous year.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention and have not been adjusted to take account of either changes in the general purchasing power of Australian dollar or changes in the prices of specific assets.

Provision for taxation

No provision for income tax was provided because of the exemption allowed under S23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1936.

Depreciation

Depreciation calculated on the diminishing value method is brought to account over the estimated economic lives of all plant and equipment.

Amortisation

The current lease of Jubilee Oval expires in 1991. Improvements to Jubilee Oval are being written off over 20 years in anticipation that the lease will be renewed at the expiration of the current lease.

NOTE 2. LOAN - ST GEORGE LEAGUE'S CLUB LIMITED (unsecured)

The loan is repayable over twenty (20) years.

NOTE 3. N.S.W.R.F.L. GROUND IMPROVEMENT LOAN (unsecured)

The loan is interest free, and repayable over seven (7) years.

NOTE 4. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

There are contingent liabilities in regard to payments due to players and a club official under contract to the Club. The amount eventually payable is dependent on the players fulfilling the conditions of the contracts.
