

BOS Annabella Boswell Papers, 1826-1901

Annabella Alexandra Campbell Boswell (nee Innes) was born and lived for 40 years in New South Wales (including several years at Lake Innes, Port Macquarie), before moving to Scotland with her husband and children in 1865. A prolific diarist and letter writer, she was concerned to pass on her memories of her life in Australia, and so collected letters and copies from members of her family and rewrote her own journals, eventually publishing some. In 1972 the Society purchased from the Boswell family in Scotland a large collection of papers and documents that included Annabella Boswell's journals and correspondence.

In 1999 it was decided to dispose of papers not related to Annabella Boswell, and consequently Patrick Boswell's correspondence with his family was sold to the State Library of New South Wales, and other papers relating to the Boswell family and estates in Scotland (mostly from the 1700s) were sold to Yale University.

The remaining papers comprise Annabella's journals and correspondence, her transcriptions of other family correspondence, her sketches and drawings, some photographs, some papers relating to her mother, and some correspondence between Patrick Boswell and his family (which appears to have been accidentally omitted from the sale to the State Library).

Her collection of papers have now been recognised for their significance and have been inscribed on the UNESCO Australian Memory of the World Register.

BOS/1 Journals and Recollections, 1846-1898

This series comprises original journals (a couple written in 1848-49, others written in the 1880s and 1890s), recollections compiled (or transcribed) from original journals that no longer exist, printed editions of some recollections, and some other notes presumably made to refresh her memory. The last item in the series appears to have been written by her husband Patrick Boswell.

[A number of the journals have been transcribed by volunteers at the Historical Society and these transcriptions are in the Society's archives. BOS/1/1 Journal, 23 March to 30 June, 1848

Written, while staying at Lake Innes, on twelve sheets of writing paper folded in half to form a "book" of 2 sections each 12 folios (24 pages). After all pages were filled once, the book was rotated 90 degrees and all pages were written over again, perpendicular to the original writing.

Begins: "Lake Innes March 23rd 1848. This is the third Thursday we have retired to rest in hope that the next morning we should be able to welcome home my Aunt and Cousins - twice we have been disappointed - the third time is always fortunate - On Wednesday 15th the Maitland passed here but did not get in until the following Monday owing to the roughness of the sea..."

Last entry commences: " June 30th - Friday - The last day of the month & the last page of my Journal & what is more of my paper!"

Parts of this journal were later re-written in BOS/1/9. The journal contains entries, after 5 May 1848, that do not appear to have been copied into later journals, and do not appear in any of the published versions of her journals.

BOS/1/2

Journal, 27 September to 15 November, 1849

Written, while staying with the Rankens at their property Saltram near Bathurst, on four sheets of writing paper folded in half to form a "book" of 8 folios (16 pages). After all pages were filled once, the book was rotated 90 degrees and all pages were written over again, perpendicular to the original writing.

Begins: "Thursday 27th - I wandered about on the plain for a long time and gathered some pretty little yellow flowers which almost cling to the ground..."

Ends: "Thursday I have taken up my pen to keep me out of mischief - but my paper is used and I have no more - It is a wet day we cannot walk, the wild flowers are closed & my needles of every sort are gone - Monday is the day feted for our departure or rather Sunday as the mail starts so early - we have spent seven happy months here - I love the place & the people but farewell to both - It may be forever in this world."

Although a later journal, BOS/1/10, also covers much of the same period, many of these entries do not appear to have been copied, or included in any published versions of Annabella's journals.

BOS/1/3

Notebook of recollections covering the period from the 1830s to the 1850s

Exercise book with marbled cover.

Written in later years from original journals and letters.

Begins "I speak for myself - I am so thoroughly Australian... From my 5th Birthday I am certain of my own identity & can follow the course of events in which I have been interested or taken any part & from the time I was 9 I have many old letters & journals with which to refresh my memory."

Contains recollections from childhood up to the 1850s, with some later corrections and annotations.

Included at the back are two inserts: one, on writing paper, continues the narrative from the last page of the book; the second, on accounting paper, contains recollections of a visit to White Rock in 1838.

BOS/1/4

First part of Journal at Lake Innes 1st May 1843 to 4 July 1843

Exercise book with marbled cover.

Written in later years from original journals and letters.

Begins: "Lake Innes, Port Macquarie. 1st May 1843 - Monday. May day - and a most perfect day it has been."

Ends: "Tuesday 4th July. Mr & Mrs Hawthorne left before lunch to Port McQuarie where they are now living, and must I am sure feel grateful to this perfect climate."

BOS/1/5

Notebook of recollections covering the period (approximately) 1850 to 1860s

Exercise book with marbled cover.

Begins: "Lake Innes was our home from Jany 1843 to Sepr 1848. We went from there to stay at Brownlow Hill, then to Saltrams from April to Novr 1849 - then to St. Clair where I remained when * Mamma and Margaret went back to Lake Innes." [* "in 1850" inserted later]

Contains recollections of her life from then until the early 1860s.

Includes a sketch of a Georgian house (unidentified) on a loose sheet of sketch paper.

Although this journal was probably used by Annabella when preparing her printed edition, not all the entries were included in her printed edition nor in subsequent published versions.

BOS/1/6

Some Recollections of My Early Days, Written at different periods by A.A.C.D. Boswell

Exercise book with dark plum cover embossed "MSS".

Written at a later period in Scotland (after the family had adopted the use of the name Douglas Boswell). Writes about the history of her family and their arrival in Australia. Largely covers the period up to 1843, with some reminiscences of her last visit to Lake Innes (possibly a rewrite of item BOS/1/3/).

On pages 101 to 107, Annabella writes about a curious incident that happened during her visit to White Rock in July 1838.

Loosely inserted into the book are two sheets of writing paper (folded to form 4 folios or 8 pages), in which Annabella gives a general description of Lake Innes House and life there.

Extracts from Old Journal, Lake Innes, 16th October 1843 to 14th May 1844

Exercise book with dark plum cover embossed "MSS".

Written at a later period in Scotland from the original journals.

Begins: "Lake Innes, Monday 16th Oct., 1843. This is the Anniversary of my Aunt's Wedding Day... "

BOS/1/8

Extracts from Old Journal, Lake Innes, 14th May 1844 to end of year

Exercise book with dark plum cover embossed "MSS".

Written at a later period in Scotland from original journal(s).

Begins: "14th May 1844. Tuesday - This is my Uncles Birthday..."

Ends: "I have got a fit of idleness & cannot say when I shall have recovered sufficiently to write again."

Includes two loose sheets of blue-grey paper (folded to make eight pages) on which are written "Extracts from my Journal Decr. 1844" describing the Christmas holiday [appears to complement pages 113 to 115 of the book].

Also includes two loose sheets of cream-coloured paper containing notes written in both ink and pencil.

BOS/1/9

Journal 1 Jan 1847 to 1848

Exercise book with dark plum cover embossed "MSS".

Written at a later period in Scotland, from the original journals.

Begins: "Lake Innes - 1 Jan 1847 - Friday - How strange it seems to write 1847!"

Last entry begins: "Friday [5 May 1848] - Mamma went to Port McQ with my Aunt to make some calls..."

- Exercise book with dark plum cover embossed "MSS".
Written at a later period in Scotland, from original journal(s).
Begins: "The beginning of 1848 was a very quiet time with us - my Uncle had had very serious losses, & the establishment at Lake Innes was greatly reduced. Port Macquarie was comparatively deserted as all the Government officials had been removed - the Steamer no longer plied between there & Sydney, so it had ceased to be the Port from New England."
Covers the period of her stay at Brownlow Hill (to April 1849) and her stay at Bathurst (to November 1849).

Begins: "We left Saltram on Tuesday morning 20th Novr 1849 - and spent a week in Sydney from Thursday morning 22nd till Wednesday night 28th. I cannot say I ever liked being there, much less do I like it when we are in a constant hurry shopping - packing & unpacking - as on this occasion for we had to leave behind some of the things we had at Bathurst, & to pack others for St. Clair."
Covers the period of her stay at St Clair until November 1851.

Begins: "Rome. Thursday 14th November 1895. After five months of very pleasant wandering we are once more settled in Rome for the winter."

- Exercise book, with label on front cover inscribed: "A.A.C.D. Boswell November 1897"
Begins: "Friday 5th November 1897. I left home with much regret, as many misgivings as to the wisdom of our plans for the winter, though we had considered the matter long and carefully."
Covers travels in France and Italy, and return via York.

BOS/1/16

Journal: About Her Garden

Written in a Cumnock Public School Copy Book, inscribed on the front cover: "A.A.C.D. Boswell, Garrallan, about her Garden"

Begins: "About my Garden. I was born and brought up in Australia which will at once explain why, when first we in this (to me) new Country I was so ignorant about some things, & so indifferent about others, that to the people I meet seemed 'matters of course'."

Some Recollections of My Early Days, written at different periods, by A.A.C.D. Boswell

2 sheets of writing paper folded to make 4 folios (8 pages), pinned together at the center of the left edge.

Extracts have been copied from journal entries for the period from 3 March to 24 March (with gaps). A drawing of the comet appears in the margin of the first page.

Begins: "Summer holidays in Australia. I have just received a letter from Sydney describing the delights of a journey to Hartley by the newly opened Railway..."

Begins: "21 Augt 1874. In my possession are some 20 years Journals of my Grandfather Douglas & altho' they are very meagre in the way of information yeat they have on many a wet day given to his Grandchildren & Great Grandchildren so much amusement that imitating him I have some notion of relating some few incidents that have occurred to myself during a somewhat uneventful life.
"The Journals of my Grandfather embrace a period from 1770 to 1807..."

BOS/2

Letters, 1826-1857

This series comprises original letters written by various members of the family and collected or retained by Annabella. Also included are numerous transcriptions of letters, presumably lent to Annabella and copied by her. Even though many of the transcriptions were made by Annabella in her later years in Scotland, the letters all relate to the period of her life in Australia.

Letter from Annabella Campbell to her daughter G.L.M. Innes, dated 1 March, 1826

Written at Bungaribee (Blacktown NSW) and addressed to Mrs Innes, Yarrows, Bathurst. The salutation is "My dearest Lorn".

Mentions Governor and Mrs Darling, the Macleays (Alexander and his family), Captain Innes [Archibald Clunes Innes], George Innes.

Letters from Annabella Innes and G.L.M. Innes to Mrs Arthur Ranken, dated 23 June, 1843

Written from Lake Innes to Mrs Ranken at Glen Logan, Lake Gilbert, Bathurst.

Annabella's letter is written on the first folio, her mother's letter on the second which, when folded, also includes the address panel.

Mentions Alexander Macleay, elections for Legislative Council.

Letter from Eliza (Dido) Innes to her cousin Margaret Innes, n.d.

Written at Sydney. The letter appears to have been written in 1846 or 1847 as it refers to both Governor and Mrs Fitzroy. Probably written by Eliza (Dido) Innes to Margaret Innes (the salutation is "My own darling Mag"), although the outside of the letter is addressed to "Mrs Geo Innes, Lake Innes, Pt McQuarie".
