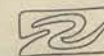

CIRCULAR LETTER

The National Dental Association of Australia
to the
Registered Dentists of the Commonwealth.

Dear Sir or Madam—

At a meeting of the Federal Council of the National Dental Association of Australia, held at Brisbane on Thursday, July 11, 1912, the enclosed Code of Ethics, which is designed to meet the requirements of the profession, was agreed to, and the Executive authorised to submit a copy of the same to every Registered Dentist throughout the Commonwealth. This Ethical Code is the outcome of much deliberation and thought on the part of the various State Societies, and is intended as a guide to those members of the Profession who desire to do the right thing in relation to their profession, and to their fellow-practitioners, and is sent to all Registered Dentists with the object of keeping them in touch with the great movements of the Profession, and with the hope that they will see it to their advantage and to the uplifting of their chosen Profession, to lend a helping hand to Dentistry in the Commonwealth.

To all Dentists, whether practising ethically or not, who are not members of Ethical Dental Societies, a strong appeal is made to join a local Society for the general good, and if practising unethically to cease doing so and become honoured members of the Dental Profession. In all professions, whether Law, Medicine, or Dentistry, "unethical" and "dishonourable" are synonymous terms, and this appeal is now made to the better judgment of such to subscribe to the "Code" enclosed herewith.

The Profession requires the help of every Dentist by Society Membership. The Dental Societies of the Commonwealth are growing, and new members are continually joining, because it is now fully recognised that keen, ambitious operators cannot afford to be left outside in the cold, the Society being the only road by which the individual's highest ambitions can be realised—namely, that of being thought well of by fellow-practitioners, together with the perfection of his skill, and the current interest in his calling that social union alone promotes and feeds on. Dental Legislation of the future must be influenced by the solid front of a united profession, and the opportunity is yours now to get in line, so that your voice may be heard, and the weight of numbers may tell, against the Profession being disgraced and outnumbered by the wholesale admission of nondescripts and the lowering of the standard and entrance to a noble Profession.

All over the Commonwealth the "old" in Dentistry is fast disappearing, and a much more skilful and educated practitioner is appearing. The great factors in this change are undoubtedly the two well-equipped Colleges at Sydney and Melbourne, the growth of Dental Societies, and the Triennial Congresses, together with the fact that many now go abroad for experience. With this greater learning and skill the desire for Society membership is rapidly increasing, the Society Meetings equalling in many respects a continuous post-graduate course. Clinics are held in every city, and the interchange of learning and methods proceeds apace. But the most benefit to the individual is the better social conditions that membership secures, all tending to lighten the burdens of the operator and make him happy in his Society relations, and the reflection that he is an honoured member of a great Profession.

We therefore take pleasure in bringing this matter before you for your earnest consideration, and look forward to seeing your name enrolled among the growing numbers of Ethical Practitioners in the Commonwealth.

The National Dental Association of Australia.

Code of Ethics as Adopted by the
Federal Council Meeting.

Held in Brisbane, Thursday, July 11th, 1912.

A.—PREAMBLE.

A dentist imbued with ethical ideals will always support and maintain the honour, usefulness, and status of his profession, and his professional relations with colleagues and patients, whose interests should be his highest consideration. He will carefully regard his civic duties, and his relation to the State, and the laws of his country, and he shall be a law-abiding citizen.

B.—CODE.

1. He shall not exhibit any plate or sign, except a window or fanlight—in which case the letters shall not exceed 6 in. square—in announcement of his business, of an area exceeding 24 by 13 in. The number of plates or signs exhibited shall be limited to two. The use of any mechanical or electrical contrivances, in lieu of a sign or signs, shall not be permissible under this clause. Nothing in this section shall prevent a dentist using the prescribed number of plates

at each place where he personally conducts an ethical practice.

2. He shall not exhibit or permit the display in connection with his name or practice, in any window, shop, or show case open to public inspection, any dental specimen, appliance, apparatus, or professional card.

3. His announcements (if any) of visits to other localities for professional purposes, shall be restricted to the following terms, viz., name and qualifications, address, date of visit, place and time of consultation, such announcements not to exceed 3 by 2 inches in any publication. The term qualification not to include any appointments held in his professional capacity.

4. He shall not maintain a standing professional card in any newspaper or public journal, except in the case of periodical visits, as prescribed in clause 3. A practitioner in

a country practice may insert his card in a local newspaper once a week, when, and only when, there is a visiting practitioner to the town in which he practises.)

5. If he shall desire to make any announcement as to the commencement or sale of his practice, termination of partnership, change of address, absence from or return to practice, this shall be done in the simplest and briefest terms, and in the case of the public press shall not exceed six consecutive issues, in all, of any one journal. In connection with the sale or transfer of a practice, notice of such shall only be sent to bona-fide patients of the vendor.

6. He shall not issue, publish, or distribute, or cause to be issued, published, or distributed, any advertisements, circulars, notices, or pamphlets, descriptive of his practice, or directing attention to a scale of professional charges, or to gratuitous treatment.

7. He shall not issue, publish, or distribute, or cause to be issued, published, or distributed, any circular, pamphlet, or treatise, or reports of cases or matters of like nature (such as hints on the care of teeth), either among his patients or the general public, unless such matter be an acknowledged reprint from his own pen in a reputable publication (provided his name is not attached thereto), or written at the request of a public institution, recognised by the Association.

Any publication printed for public sale is excepted from this clause.

8. He shall not meet in consultation with any person who is not a reputable and registered dental or medical practitioner.

9. He shall not be in partnership, or association, or financially interested in a practice carried on by an unethical dentist, which would be described by this Association as an advertising or "quack" practice.

10. He shall not pay a commission or give other valuable consideration for the introduction of patients, nor consent to become the appointed dentist to any benefit society, the members of which are entitled to professional attention at a nominal sum per head.

11. He shall not describe himself as a specialist in any branch of dentistry, unless his practice is confined to that specialty.

12. He shall not allow his name to appear on dentifrices, tooth-brushes, or proprietary articles.

13. He shall not use the letters R.D.S., or any other combination of letters likely to mislead the public, in any way whatsoever.

14. In the event of any dispute arising as to the interpretation of this Code of Ethics, the State Dental Council of the State in which the dispute occurs shall decide the matter.

HISTORY OF THE DENTAL HOSPITAL'S SERVICES OF BRISBANE

in Chap I

Brisbane, in her Centenary Year, can proudly boast of her growth and achievements in public dentistry, especially over the last quarter century. It may be claimed that the present vast organisation of dental services under the control of the Brisbane and South Coast Hospitals Board began in 1908 when a small group of practising dentists, members of the Odontological Society of Queensland, decided to establish a Dental Clinic to give relief of pain to those persons who could not afford private dental treatment. With the financial help of members of the dental profession, a Dental Supply House, the Walter and Eliza Hall Trust, and public-spirited business people, a Clinic was established on the top floor of Harper's Building, Elizabeth Street. It consisted of a one-chair surgery and a waiting room, and was serviced for mornings only during the first year in an honorary capacity by practising dentists. During this initial period extractions only were performed, the first year attendances being 1,900. It is interesting to note that total attendances at the Brisbane Dental Hospitals during the year ended 30th June, 1959, were 301,176.

In 1908, the administration of the Clinic was conducted by a Committee of Dentists who were members of the Odontological Society, but the demand for service soon grew and dental students who were apprenticed to registered Dentists attended the Clinic for experience. In 1912, a full-time Dentist-cum-Supervisor was appointed and the Dental Clinic was also used to conduct examinations for students. As the demand for service increased beyond the capacity to cope with it, the urgent need for larger premises was evident.

For the purpose of setting up and equipping a larger and better Dental Clinic, in 1916 the top floor of "Westbourn", a residence in George Street, was made available by the Government to the Dental Committee of the Dental Clinic. The new premises initially consisted of a conservative surgery, extraction surgery, waiting room, students' dining room, and other spare rooms not being used. However, there was no provision made for prosthetic work. By this time, dental students were compelled to attend the Dental Clinic for the last two years of their apprenticeship. In 1926 the apprenticeship system was eliminated and students were enrolled by the Joint Board of Dental Studies for a four-year dental course. The public dental health service was largely that given by dental students during the last two years of their training, assisted by the Superintendent and the Visiting Honorary Dentists. By that time the Clinic was being subsidised by the Education Departments to the extent of £750 per annum. To appreciate the size of the Clinic at that period, it is interesting to note that there were four chairs in the conservative surgery and one in the exodontia surgery.

Prior to the year 1921, alterations were carried out to accommodate thirteen dental chairs. By 1926, the number of students had increased to 43, the whole of the building was taken over by the then Home Department, and its administration transferred to the Brisbane and South Coast Hospitals Board. The building was reconstructed into a Dental Hospital, with twenty-five conservative dental chairs, two extraction chairs and two prosthetic chairs. The Honorary Dentists' services to the Dental Hospital were no longer necessary and terminated.

In 1927 a prosthetic service with four dental mechanics was established, in addition to that rendered by students, to supply dentures to eligible patients. Also, in 1927, a full-time Assistant Superintendent was appointed. This was another beginning which was destined to result in a very fine and modern Dental School and a first-class Dental Hospital Service for Brisbane. Through the popularity of the Dental Hospital, both patients and dental students increased in numbers to such an extent that it became evident that the teaching service would have to expand and a separate Dental Health Service be set up.

In 1933, two full-time Dentists were employed to work in the conservative surgery to supplement the work done by students.

In 1935 a Faculty of Dentistry was formed and took the full responsibility of training dental students. The Brisbane and South Coast Hospitals Board, however, remained responsible for the dental health of the eligible public and developed a dental health service, co-ordinated with but separate from the teaching service, in the same building. At this time there were six Dentists employed by the Brisbane and South Coast Hospitals Board.

In 1937, to relieve overcrowding of patients at the Dental Hospital, suburban Clinics were opened on a part-time basis at Wynnum, Redcliffe and Sandgate, and later on at Cribb Island.

By 1940, eight Dentists were employed in the Board's Dental Hospital's Health Service. The need which had been recognised earlier for increased accommodation culminated in the erection of a modern Dental Hospital and College in Turbot Street. The Hospital and School were transferred to this building in 1941.

During the War, which ended in 1945, growth of the service was somewhat slow. In 1946, the demand for service became so great that an evening service of three sessions per week was introduced at the Brisbane Dental Hospital to supplement work performed during the day. This has proved so popular that, in 1959, three evening sessions per week are still worked at the Brisbane Dental Hospital with some five hundred patients being attended to in the evenings of each week.

Since 1946, the day service has grown tremendously, including separate Specialist Departments in Anaesthetics, Oral Surgery, Prosthetics, Pedodontia, Orthodontia, Operative Dentistry, Periodontia. All visiting ancillary services have been extended to include the Brisbane Hospital, Eventide Home, Her Majesty's Prison, South Brisbane Hospital.

In 1951, alterations were made to the Wynnum Dental Clinic, converting it to a two-Dentist Clinic.

In 1953 it became necessary to expand still further, and a new Dental Hospital was established on the top floor of the South Brisbane Fire Brigade building in Vulture Street. This Hospital provided accommodation for twenty Dentists, including Specialist Departments in Prosthetics, Pedodontia, Orthodontia, Operative Dentistry and Periodontia.

A Central Bulk Dental Store for the Dental Hospitals and Queensland Dental Clinics was inaugurated in July, 1953. The purpose of this was to maintain supplies in bulk and to expedite the execution of requisitions from the various Clinics.

In 1954 the Sandgate Dental Clinic was changed from a part-time to a full-time Clinic. In June, 1955, this Clinic was transferred to another building in Loudon Street, Sandgate, where new surgeries were equipped to accommodate two Dentists. The treatment was extended to include Prosthetics and Radiography. Also, during the year, a modern dental surgery was included in the Brisbane Chest Hospital and functions on a part-time basis.

In recent years, both Hospitals with their fifty-four Dentists and ancillary staff have been extended to capacity, both with respect to accommodation of staff and patients. It will be seen by the Annual Statistical Returns that the volume and output of work have increased not only in range, but numerically, to a peak achievement in this Centenary Year. Thus what began as a gesture by a handful of Dentists of the Odontological Society in 1908 has, in this comparatively short time, given birth not only to a modern Dental School with its own Faculty of Dentistry, but one of the largest Dental Hospitals and Clinic Services of its kind in Australia.

The ordinary monthly meeting of the Society was held in the rooms Dental Hospital Elizabeth Street on Tuesday 18th November¹⁹¹³ at 8 pm.

Present. The President (P. M. Coughlin) occupied the chair, others members present including Mess^{rs} Jew, Wills, Sagar, Webb, D. Hurworth, A. Mrs McNaught, D. Gibson Lacaze, White, Wood, Parker, Henderson Moscom, J. F. McNaught, T. B. Hunter (Hon Solicitor) & Hon Sec. (J. S. Gully).

Expediting Business On the meeting being called together, Mr Henderson suggested to the President, that on account of the lengthy programme, business should be got through as expeditiously as possible. The President replied that the expediting of formal business had already been arranged for.

Minutes. The minutes of last meeting were read & confirmed.

Correspondence outwards (to Home Secretary Dept.; Immigration & Customs Bureau; E. R. P. Wainwright - Naumborn) Photographic Society & inwards was dealt with.

Treasurers Report. The Hon Treasurer (Mr H. W. Wills) reported a credit balance Accounts for £5-7-0. were passed for payment (including Simpson & Jackson Hon Secy (Stamps &c 1/19/16) Photographic Society 5/- An amount of £2-2-0. (Mathewson & Co) for lantern slides was also passed.

Lantern Lecture. Mr W. D. Parker delivered a lecture on "Proximal Decay in Bicuspids & Molars", illustrated by lantern slides taken from Dr Black's "Operative Dentistry". The lantern was lent by the Dental Photographic Socy & operated by Mr Knowan (Harrington St) (For paper see Journal)

Mr Parker dealt with the cause of dental decay, its progress, & prevention. The lecture concluded with a number of slides showing proper preparation of cavities.

Discussion Mr Henderson asked in what way the lecturer did not altogether agree with Dr Black's methods. Mr Parker said there was not any part of Dr Black's method that he did not agree with, but he had not followed out his method in every detail. Dr Lacaze said that the enamel around pin hole cavities was always infected for a good distance beyond the ^{cavity} margins. Mr A. Mrs McNaught mentioned having seen some pin hole cavities, filled with gold, the fillings having been done by Dr Belasario (Sydney) 32 years ago. Dr Hurworth paid a tribute to Dr Black for his theory of "Extension for Prevention". Particularly was this theory to be advocated in regard to children's teeth. Mr Wills recommended considerable separation & the use of stones. Mr Parker mentioned that the slides are the property of the society; he

hoped another lecture would be given in connection with them. The President asked if it would not be better to fill spaces between the seats, by building the filling out larger than the normal size of the booth. He thanked Mr Parker for the trouble he had taken in preparing the lecture.

A hearty vote of thanks was accorded the lecturer.

Reason for meeting The President announced the reason for calling

every endeavor to prevent this registration (of
Mr Matthew) by the Home Secretary, because in this
way the Home Sec. can register any one who cares
to apply & who has sufficient influence behind him.

The President read letter from Mess. McCowan &
Lightoller (solicitors for G. P. P. Wainwright, Hambour)

The paper covered a lot of ground. one of the principle points brought out was; what could be done to prevent dental decay, he thought that if in each country the foodstuffs, climate and water were studied a little more it would be a great help.

Mr. Coughlin thought Dr. Walker would have said more about heredity, he would like to thank him for his paper and hoped others would come forward as Dr. Walker had done so that we would have a paper for every meeting;

Dr. Hurworth asked where the Orthodontist would come in, he thought that the broad arch "John Bull" type of face was disappearing and a much narrower type taking its place which must affect mastication very much, he also thought that "Fletchers" method of mastication helped to prevent decay and broaden the arch,

Dr. Butler-Wood expressed his appreciation of Dr. Walker's paper, he thought that the lateral incisor would soon disappear as the third molar had almost done, in countries where the whole grain is used the teeth are much better, insalivation is the principal point, he also thought it would be a great help if mothers were taught to eat proper foods, Mr. Hughes said that one thing about mastication was that the rice eating people

usually eat the rice in a soft form so that there is not much mastication needed.

M^r Frew also thanked D^r Walker for his paper and mentioned that in Germany where black bread is eaten dental decay is going on there just the same as else-where, he had noticed that the teeth of people living in the country had well formed crowns but fillings did not last as well in their teeth as they did in the teeth of towns people, showing that mastication is not the principal factor but that it must be insalivation, D^r Walker in reply thanked the members for the interest taken in his paper, he did not think mastication or insalivation was the cause of all the trouble, we will have to go back to the beginning as decay is just the same wherever civilization has taken place.

Dr B. Wood in reply to Mr Henderson said he used the green was as he found it very easy to work, he liked the twenty one carat gold this being a little harder than sovereign gold & stood the strains of mastication better.

Mr Coughlin also thanked Dr B. Wood for his paper, he thought his method of taking the was impression a very good one.

Mr Coughlin found that when gold had been melted several times in casting inlays it got very hard, he found that by adding a few pellets of Rowan's gold the gold was much easier to fuse.

Mr Wills thought Dr B. Woods method a very good one of passing a piece of silk between the filling and the approximate tooth to make sure that there was good contact.

Mr Few thanked Dr B. Wood, and said when recently in Sydney he found that Dr Bradburn had gone back to the method of taking an impression of the cavity and making the wax shape from a model.

Mr Coughlin's Paper, The President then asked Mr Coughlin to read his paper entitled, "Pyorrhoea Alveolaris" Mr Coughlin said he could not attempt in the time at his disposal to formulate any new theories, he thought the "ionization" treatment a very good one, Another

treatment which had given him good results was that of applying a 25% solution of sulphuric acid to the gingival margin and roots of the affected teeth, in very bad cases he used an old remedy viz, zinc chloride.

Discussion on Mr Parker thanked Mr Coughlin for his Mr Coughlin's paper, interesting paper, he thought pyorrhoea alveolaris was incurable, the question he would like to ask; what is it, and how do you get attachment of the gum tissue, he used zinc chloride and zinc sulphate four grains to the ounce and massaged the gums well.

Mr Wills said he had a patient a boy eight years of age with a number of teeth in a bad state through pyorrhoea.

Mr Few added his thanks to Mr Coughlin for his paper, he had one case of a lady sixty eight years of age, who had very good teeth but badly affected with pyorrhoea, he scaled the teeth and treated them with a 60% solution of sulphuric acid, and advised milk of magnesia as a mouth wash, he saw the patient some months after and the teeth and gums appeared to be in perfect order.

Mr Coughlin in reply thanked the members for the interest taken in his paper.

Discussion on Dr. Gibson's Paper

Dr. Butler-Wood asked what carat gold he used

Dr. Gibson in reply said he used Australian twenty two carat gold.

Mr. Carl found that if the wax shape was moistened with water before investing the inlay came out with very good edges, ~~he~~ this acted just as well as coating the wax shape with a soap solution.

Mr. Thompson said he thought that all inlays which included the incisal edge should be supported with a post in the canal, he thought it was always best to extract the pulp in these cases, as he considered the pulp of no more use when the root of the tooth was fully formed.

Dr. Butler-Wood thought the pulp ought to be preserved when ever possible, he used a soap solution on the wax form before investing.

Mr. Stephens thought that Dr. Gibson's cavity preparations were splendid and that there is a lot to be learnt from them, he does not believe in destroying the pulp except when necessary, he found that by making a step in the inlay you can get very good retention.

Dr. Walker complimented Dr. Gibson for his paper he followed out Dr. Blackes method of cavity preparation, he also always took two wax forms for an inlay as he found that when the inlays were cast one usually fitted better than the other.

The President also thanked Dr. Gibson for his paper he found that irides platinum wire worked very well as posts for inlays, he had also tried silver wire but found that silver caused

the tooth to stain green, the President then asked Dr. Butler-Wood to read Mr. Conochans paper entitled,

Some thoughts on Oral Hygiene and Orthodontia, Mr. Conochan in his paper brought forward many interesting points with regard to the cause of so much irregularity of the teeth, he also described his method of treating these cases.

On the motion of Dr. Butler-Wood seconded by Mr. Coughlin a vote of thanks was tendered to Mr. Conochan for his paper.

Before the meeting started the President gave an interesting demonstration with the "Clark Analgesic" out-fit, Mr. England offered to be the first patient as he had not had very much success with the out-fit, this proved to be a very interesting demonstration as the lower teeth were well separated without the patient feeling any pain, Mr. Ward also offered himself as a patient this demonstration also proved to be very successful, Dr. Walker opened up two teeth for Mr. Ward and extracted the pulps without any pain, the first tooth being an upper molar and the second an upper cuspid.

Mr. Ward described his experience of the analgesia as being a very pleasant one, he could feel the drilling on the teeth and the pulps being extracted, but he did not feel any actual pain.

D^r Hurworth D^r Hurworth added his thanks for D^r Page's paper and said there were many cases where vaccine therapy need not be reached. Instrumentation could do a lot. The D^r said there was a condition present during the eruption of the third molars which was very like a pyorrhoeal condition.

D^r Hurworth mentioned cases in pregnant women who had mouth trouble apart from pyorrhoea, he suspected kidney trouble. Some of these women died during child birth.

D^r Parker D^r Parker referred to an article he had seen, which dealt with early treatment. He thought some of the tooth powders had a great deal to do with recession of gums. He also said it was remarkable the improvement that took place after the removal of affected teeth, say where only one or two were affected and these were removed, the others seemed to get all right.

D^r Butler Wood Patients sometimes asked for the removal of a loose tooth to save the others. The D^r mentioned a number of interesting cases in practice bearing on the subject of the paper. He also added his thanks to D^r Page for the paper and said "It does us good, at times, to exchange ideas with others".

paper written by D^r Kirk, which appeared in the "Cosmos" some time ago.

 a piece of grass and so caused an acute abscess to develop.

A Paper entitled "Some Notes on the Management
 of Children's Teeth" was read by the Honorary Secretary
 Discussion — Mr. P. M. Coughlin thanked
 the Essayist for his Paper; he was against the
 use of Arsenic in deciduous teeth, and favoured
 pressure anaesthesia. He advocated the use of AgNO₃
 but did not favour neutralizing with NaCl as it formed
 an insoluble inert silver chloride, which could not possibly

have any effect on the teeth. He thought the idea of using Spt. Vini rect. an excellent one.

Dr. E. S. Martin advocated the use of both cocaine pressure and arsenic. He thought the judgement of the Operator should guide him in its use.

Dr. F. G. Butler - Wood said he had given up the use of Arsenic and had found no place for it in his practice, during the last twelve years. In deciduous teeth he used a mixture of carbolic acid and cocaine placed on the exposed pulp under a certain amount of pressure and had good results. He always warned patients not to use carbolic mouth washes or tooth powders. He also wished to sound a warning note against the use of AgNO_3 in cavities close to the pulp.

Dr. A. R. Walker opposed the extraction of teeth not in occlusion. He failed to see why, because a tooth did not occlude that it should be taken out if it were sound. In devitalizing deciduous teeth, on the whole he used pressure anaesthesia more than arsenic, and thought he got better results.

Dr. C. W. Hurworth thought that Saturdays mornings were always the most trying mornings in a dental practice because of the attendance of the children.

He opposed the extraction of sound teeth simply because they did not occlude. He used Arsenic and cocaine pressure for devitalization and got good results with both. He thought the use of AgNO_3 was excellent. He also in cases of putrescent pulps got good results with Formo Cresol. In fact he noticed that putrescent temporary teeth responded to treatment much more readily than permanent teeth in the same condition.

Mr. W. R. Eden congratulated the O. S. J. on his Paper but thought he could add nothing of interest to the discussion.

Mr. W. H. Wills asked if any Member knew of anything to prevent the discolouration of teeth due to the action of AgNO_3 .

Mr. C. G. Frew stated he got better results with a mixture of Cobalt and Cocaine than with Arsenic in devitalization.

Mr. C. R. Thompson made a suitable reply and thanked the Members for the way the Paper had been received.

He was pleased to see that it had brought a good discussion.

Dr Martini spoke of the rivalry of the different schools in America & quoted the Formalin School & Buckley. He advised caution in the matter & said Di-chloramine T had been used in Egypt but with an intensely irritating effect.

Mr Macrossan stated he was using Carrol-Dakin's solution for extractions & pyorrhoea, but accurate checking was necessary. When first used an irritating effect had ^{been produced} resulted, due to caustic alkali, but now he was getting good results. He however did not use it for root sterilization.

Dr Martini stated his remarks were meant to apply to infected teeth only. He dealt with the

Mr Loughlin referred to the irritating effect of the Carnol-Dakin solution. He spoke of the application of a solution of chloric zinc or salt by the ionization method. New antiseptics were very often patented preparations.

use of formalin, especially in a fumes form.

Mr Macrossan said the Carnol-Dakin solution was not used in Brisbane, Ennad and Essol being sold therefor.

Dr Menzies said he had not brought the matter forward as a new cure, but merely for the purpose of making members' au fait with what was going on.

The President thanked Dr Menzies for bringing the subject before the Society, as it was the duty of members to consider any new matter of interest. He spoke of his experience with formalin, dating back 20 years. He suggested waiting until definite results of the new antiseptic came along.

Special features - First, symmetrical eruption of permanent canines outside the deciduous ones making them look on first glance into the mouth as if she had three bicuspids on each side; secondly - perfect eruption of all four bicuspids and thirdly the almost perfect alignment of all the teeth.

(b) A specimen one inch long shaped like a canine was given him recently by a lady patient, aged about 38 years, of medium height & build. History. A hard swelling under the left side of tongue opposite second molar, ^{resists gradually} subsiding, but no pain or inconvenience. She consulted a Dr who wanted to operate & remove it. As there was no pain she decided to wait a while. Shortly afterwards when brushing her teeth she felt the end of the brush strike something hard. On looking into the mouth she thought she saw a little pus oozing out. In trying to wipe it away she encountered a hard

Substance protruding, which she grasped with tweezers & drew out, big and firm. It looks as if it were a temporary canine covered with salivary calculus.

Dr Butler-Wood mentioned a case of extraction of a second upper molar with 3 roots parallel & which measured a shade over an inch between the gingival margin and the apex.

(3) Model showing missing lateral lingual surface of central facing labially. Perfect alignment of teeth.

Dr. A.R. Walker mentioned two cases of congenital absence of teeth:-

- (a) Boy aged 6, one of twins. His brother exactly the same. Cast shows absence of lower central incisors & lateral incisors. The mother states she had exactly the same condition when a child. This seems to be confirmed as she is minus the central & lateral incisors in the permanent set as well.
- (b) Child aged 11. Congenital absence of 2nd bicuspid on left side. Took an X ray to confirm this.

Dr. A.R. Menzies presented a model of a boy, aged 4 years, with incisors all in at 2 years of age.

Mr. R.S.P. Pennington handed round X rays of the following case:- Girl aged 9. No sign of right upper central incisor. High up in vestibulum oris close under right nostril firm rounded swelling probably unerupted tooth. Postero anterior plate taken. This shows two unerupted teeth superimposed in place of right upper central. I followed this plate with two

intra-oral films (a+b) in different planes showing a cuspid like supernumerary lying lingual to an apparently normal but labially mal-placed central. - Under local anaesthesia a V shaped incision was made the firm tissue laid back lingually exposing apex of supernumerary which was then extracted. This specimen, as you will see, somewhat simulates a right upper cuspid but the cuspid itself as radiograph shows is coming down in fairly normal position though the root is more fully formed than would have been expected. A 2nd intra oral ray taken after extraction shows the central clearly. The models here show that this child is abnormally early in the eruption of her permanent dentition. An older sister aged 12 has congenital absence of both upper laterals, the place of the upper lateral being taken by a conical supernumerary. Unfortunately no family history of dental abnormalities can be obtained as the children's parents are not living in Australia.

Mr. J.W. Ward dealing with hereditary traits mentioned a case in 1862 or thereabouts of a mother & child both with supernumerary thumbs.

Mr. H.W. Wills stated:-

that the specimen shown at March Meeting was sawn through longitudinally and transversely at the large end. There was no sign of a canal, but the very centre of the big end seemed more dense, as if it has been a small solid body for some time, and was the nucleus of the specimen, whose shape and size must have been determined by the duct it came from. The skiagram taken from the front and sagittal aspects showed no sign of a canal especially when photographed beside 2 teeth about the same size. It was harder to saw through than a root of the same size would be. It was solid calculus throughout.

He also presented the following specimen:-

A canine (upper left) root with a good deal of exostosis on the apical 1/2 of the root. A pivot crown had been put on, without any attempt at cleaning and treating the pulp canal. A false canal had been made coming through 3/16 inch from the gum margin, the post of the crown had been pushed nearly an eighth of an inch beyond the orifice. The patient consulted me to have the crown replaced but I took out the root instead.

Iocaine was injected & dissected muscles from the bullet & gradually extracted it. The bullet showed deposits where it was attached to the muscles. Bullet was about 1 1/4 in long. Patient is quite alright now.

There was a pocket on the mesial surface, deeper than usual. He found a cavity in the root below the gum margin. In this cavity the pulp was exposed. He opened up the lingual surface & paralyzed & extracted the pulp. He filled the root with gutta percha & the lingual cavity with amalgam.

At subsequent sittings the gum was pressed away, then the cavity cut to receive a gold inlay to which the tissues took kindly, the gum closing over the gold & hiding the upper 2/3 thirds of it, the filling having to be carried part way down the enamel surface of the tooth.

IN THE COURT OF INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION OF QUEENSLAND.

No. 241 of 1922.

THE PRESIDENT.

In the Matter of an Application by the Federated Miscellaneous Workers' Union of Australia (Queensland Branch) for an Award for employees engaged in the Dental Industry in the State of Queensland.

DENTAL MECHANICS' AWARD—STATE.

THIS matter coming on for hearing before the Court of Industrial Arbitration, at Brisbane, on 22nd June, 1922: This Court, after hearing Mr. S. J. Bryan on behalf of the Federated Miscellaneous Workers' Union of Australia (Queensland Branch), and Messrs. J. W. Ward and W. R. Parker on behalf of the employers in the calling, and after reading the agreement arrived at in conference by the representatives of the parties, doth award as follows:—

APPLICATION OF AWARD.

1. The Award shall apply to all classes of employees mentioned herein within the State of Queensland, with the exception of apprentices registered by the Dental Board.

DIVISIONS.

2. Northern Division.—That portion of the State along or north of a line commencing at the junction of the sea-coast with the 21st parallel of south latitude; thence by that parallel of latitude due west to 147 degrees of east longitude; thence by that parallel of longitude due south to 22 degrees 30 minutes of south latitude; thence by that parallel of latitude due west to the western border of the State.

Mackay Division.—That portion of the State within the following boundaries:—Commencing at the junction of the sea-coast with the 21st parallel of south latitude; thence by that parallel of latitude due west to 147 degrees of east longitude; thence by that parallel of longitude due south to 22 degrees of south latitude; thence by that parallel of latitude due east to the sea-coast; thence by the sea-coast northerly to the point of commencement.

Southern Division.—That portion of the State not included in the Northern or Mackay Divisions.

DISTRICTS.

Northern Division—

Eastern District.—That portion of the Northern Division along or east of 144 degrees 30 minutes of east longitude.

Western District.—The remainder of the Northern Division.

Southern Division—

Eastern District.—That portion of the Southern Division along or east of a line commencing at the junction of the southern border of the State with 150 degrees of east longitude; thence by that parallel of longitude due north to 25 degrees of south latitude; thence by that parallel of latitude due west to 147 degrees of east longitude; thence by that parallel of longitude due north to the southern boundary of the Mackay Division.

Western District.—The remainder of the Southern Division.

HOLIDAYS.

3. (1) All work done by any employee on Good Friday, Labour Day (the first Monday in May) or other day appointed under "The Holidays Act of 1912" to be kept in place of that

holiday), and Christmas Day shall be deemed overtime work, and shall be paid for at double rates. All work done by any employee on the following holidays—namely, New Year's Day, the twenty-sixth day of January, the twenty-fifth day of April (Anzac Day), Easter Monday, the Birthday of the Sovereign, Exhibition Day, Boxing Day, or on any day appointed under "The Holidays Act of 1912" to be kept in the place of any such holiday—shall be deemed overtime work, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half.

(2) For the purpose of subclause (1)—

"Time and a-half" shall mean a half-day's wage in addition to the wage prescribed herein, or *pro rata* if there is more or less than a day.

"Double time" shall mean one day's wages in addition to the wage prescribed herein, or *pro rata* if there is more or less than a day.

(3) Employees shall be allowed six (6) days' continuous holidays on full pay after twelve (12) months' service, to be calculated from the date of engagement.

The holidays must be given within one month of the expiration of such twelve months' service or a monetary *pro rata* equivalent. If an employee is dismissed or resigns after completing six months' service, he shall receive three days' pay.

HOURS.

4. The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty-four in any one week, and shall be worked between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday, with one hour for lunch between the hours of 12 o'clock noon and 2 p.m.: Provided that in any town where the weekly half-holiday is observed on a day other than Saturday, that day shall be substituted for Saturday herein.

WAGES.

5. (1) Dental mechanics of five years' experience—£4 12s. 6d. per week.

A mechanic having five years' experience shall be entitled to a minimum wage of £5 per week on passing the examination next hereinafter provided.

A committee of two representatives of the Odontological Society of Queensland and two representatives of the Federated Miscellaneous Workers' Union of Australia (Queensland Branch), Dental Section, shall be appointed within one month to conduct an examination within three months, and at any subsequent date specified by the committee, and in such places as the committee may determine, as to the competency of any employee in the work usually performed by dental mechanics.

Should the committee be unable to agree regarding any matter in relation to the examination, an umpire (whose decision shall be final) shall be appointed either by the committee, or by the Court in the event of the committee's failure to make such appointment.

(2) Casual mechanics—3s. 6d. per hour, with a minimum payment of 10s.

(3) Casual employee shall be an employee who is employed for less than one week.

OVERTIME.

6. Employees working outside the usual starting or finishing hours in excess of forty-four hours per week or eight hours per day shall be paid for the time so worked at one and a-half times the ordinary rate.

Inserted a pellet of cotton wool with about a drop of P.S.A under P. seal. Was able to get through the secondary dentine & remove the pulp with scarcely any pain.

Dr A.R. Menzies produced models and X-rays of a prot. apt 21 who had a mixture of 1st & 2nd teeth. Retaining several deciduous teeth the lower models showed the only teeth in the lower were the right

wisdom both & 2 deciduous molars. The X rays showed 2 unerupted bicuspids. He also produced an X ray of an impacted canine on the palate & handed round for inspection a large pulp stone.
